**Parking Authority First Step to Solve Problem**

Georgetown will soon have a new municipal body. Monday a 5-3 council decision was made to establish a Parking Authority. The 3-man board will be in charge of all public parking facilities. Salaries can be paid, but must be set by a separate by-law.

Cr. Rex Cook, who with Cr. Harrison moved for passing of a by-law, said that parking facilities are overdue and this is a first step in solving them. Reeve Elliott, though voting for the motion said he does not approve if it means more on public parking lots.

**Parking Vital**  
Parking is vital to the downtown area, said Mayor Sargent,

not only for individual merchants but for the town which derives a considerable tax revenue from properties.

With Cr. McNelly also supporting the move, opponents were Deputy Reeve Hunter, Cr. Zimmerman and Cr. Berzgar, the latter voting against it because, as a downtown merchant, he said there would be "too much interest." Cr. Jim Brown was not at Monday's meeting.

**Ontario Street Widening Plans Are Snagged**

"The last time I'll burden you with the proposal this year" said Cr. Fred Harrison bitterly when a Harrison-Cock motion to widen Ontario St. to the regulation 66 feet found no other council supporters Monday.

Questioned by Deputy Reeve Hunter, Cr. Harrison said land would have to be expropriated for the widening and cost figures were not produced for what the deputy said he believed would be an expensive project.

**Others First**  
Reeve Elliott said there had been no funds budgeted, but Cr. Harrison there would be no cost this year as the motions would take some time to implement.

The deputy reeve said he could not favour spending money on Ontario St. when many east end streets need improvements and are more heavily travelled.

"We've got Ewing St. as an approach to the factories," he said.

"And where would we be if a council a few years back hadn't used foresight in extending Ewing over the creek," snapped Cr. Harrison "I'm just trying to look ahead a few years and with the railway crossing closed we will need another approach to our factories."

**More on Cost**  
Mayor Sargent said he agreed with the motion's intent but needed more information on the costs before he could support it.

"I can't understand how we can talk about poor planning one minute when we talk about the John St. subway and turn

down something which will be a future requirement," exclaimed Cr. Cook after the vote was turned down.

**Leaking Gas Tank Thought Fire Cause**

A leaking gas tank was blamed for a fire at Wilson Welding on Water St. Wednesday morning.

Fire Chief Bob Bonfield said that Cy Wilson was welding a trailer hitch on a 1961 Plymouth Fury for a customer when the back of the car caught fire. The trunk was blackened slightly but there was little damage.

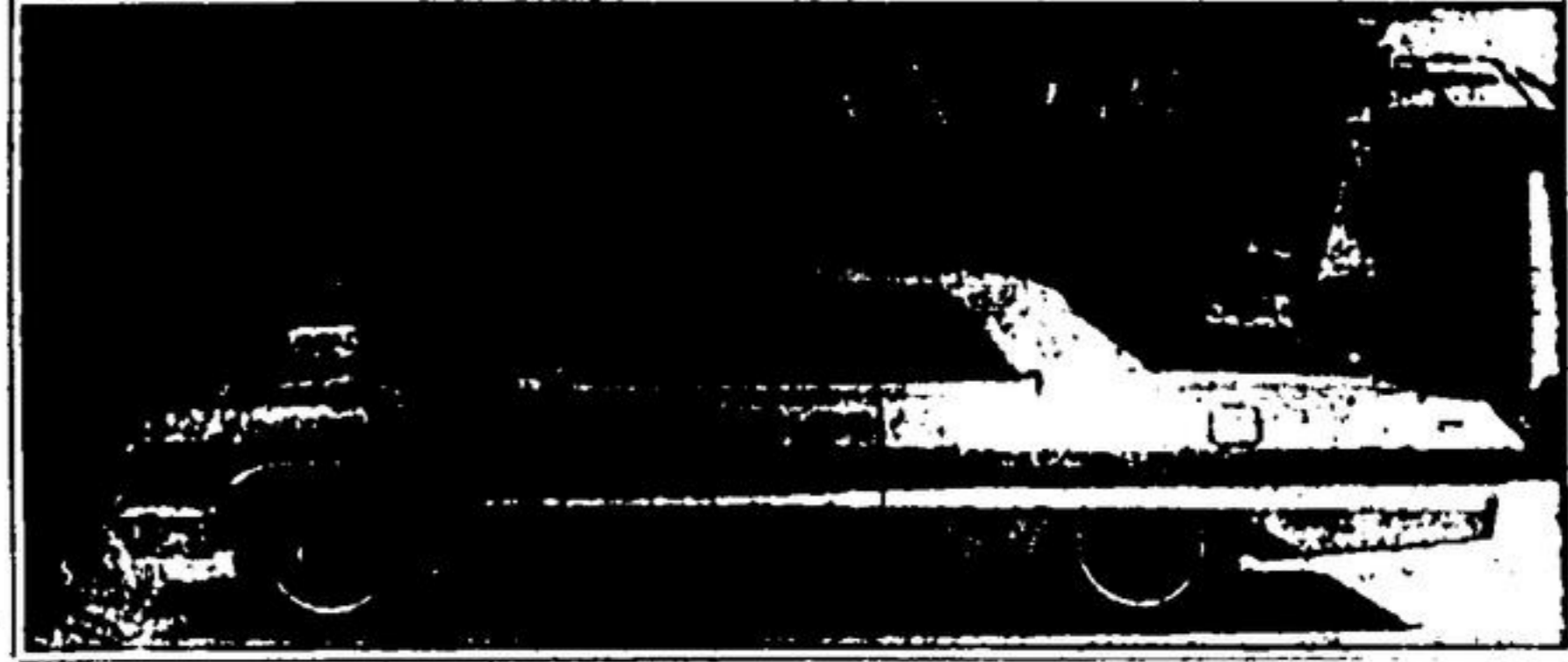
