No Deer Season In Halton County

As announced earlier by County Council there will again be no deer season in Halton County this year. J. W. Spooner, minister of lands and forests, announced previously in the year that a three day deer season could be arranged in Southern Ontario for all the counties of the district, providing the counties raised no serious objections.

So far 13 of the 31 counties in Southern Ontario have objected to the deer season. Halton, Wellington, Perth, Middlesex, Elgin, Lincoln, Essex, York, Ontario, Victoria, Addison, Hastings and Prince Edward counties are opposed to the plan.

In favor of the plan are: Brant, Dufferin, Durham, Northumberland, Frontenac, Grey, Halton, Huron, Kent, Lambton, Norfolk, Oxford, Peel, Simcoe, Waterloo, Welland and Wentworth.

It has been known for several years that there has been a great increase in the deer population in Southern Ontario. However, it was not known until scientists at the OVC announced that deer in some areas of Southern Ontario were crowding together that disease was spreading among cattle.
