Advice is Given To Duck Hunters

Lake Huron district conservation officer E. Liddle has a preopening day message to all duck hunters. He asks that hunters think of other things beside the duck.

1. Make sure you are a safe distance from other hunters.
2. Allow the birds to get close enough to you before you fire so that you won't just wound them.
3. Don't forget what time it is and stay in the blind in the evening until it is too late for a safe return to the shore or from where you set out.
4. Keep an eye on the weather and if it is threatening and you have to cross water in a boat, be sure you get out before a storm makes water travel unsafe.
5. Check your equipment, be sure you have oars or a paddle in case of motor failure.
6. Be sure you have enough gas.
7. Observe the rules of water safety.
8. After one half an hour after sunset make sure your gun is dismantled or encased.
9. If it is too dark to find cripples it is too dark to shoot, regardless of what time it is.

"Please do not leave your common sense at home when you go hunting," says the officer.
