Saw Scale Model Of Nuclear Power

Thousands of Canadian National Exhibition visitors who strolled through the Ontario Government Building this year were interested and intrigued by a large, shiny machine, set in front of the department of Energy and Resources display. The machine seems incongruous for the exhibit was featuring a miniature (three feet in diameter) model of the nuclear power station which will be completed at Kincairdine in 1965 and many local people who have camped at Inverhuron Park, have seen the real station in progress.

The words "nuclear," "ission," and "atoms," usually lead off most queries to the attendant and, always, the finger is pointed at the mysterious machine.

This rather impressive attraction is a motor from an RCAF Sabre Jet and has no concrete connection with atomic energy.

Real Gimmick

Fair visitors, by first examining the giant engine, went further and they learned about things to come.
They learned, for instance, that the Kincairdine station will be a 200,000 kilowatt station for electrical power.
They also learned that, despite the roar and grandeur of Niagara Falls, that southern Ontario needs power.
And then they learned that in years to come, these atomic stations will be dotted around strategic parts of Ontario.
The Sabre Jet Engine?
A government spokesman summed it up this way: "The engine suggests energy and the Hon. Robert Macaulay is certainly resourceful!"

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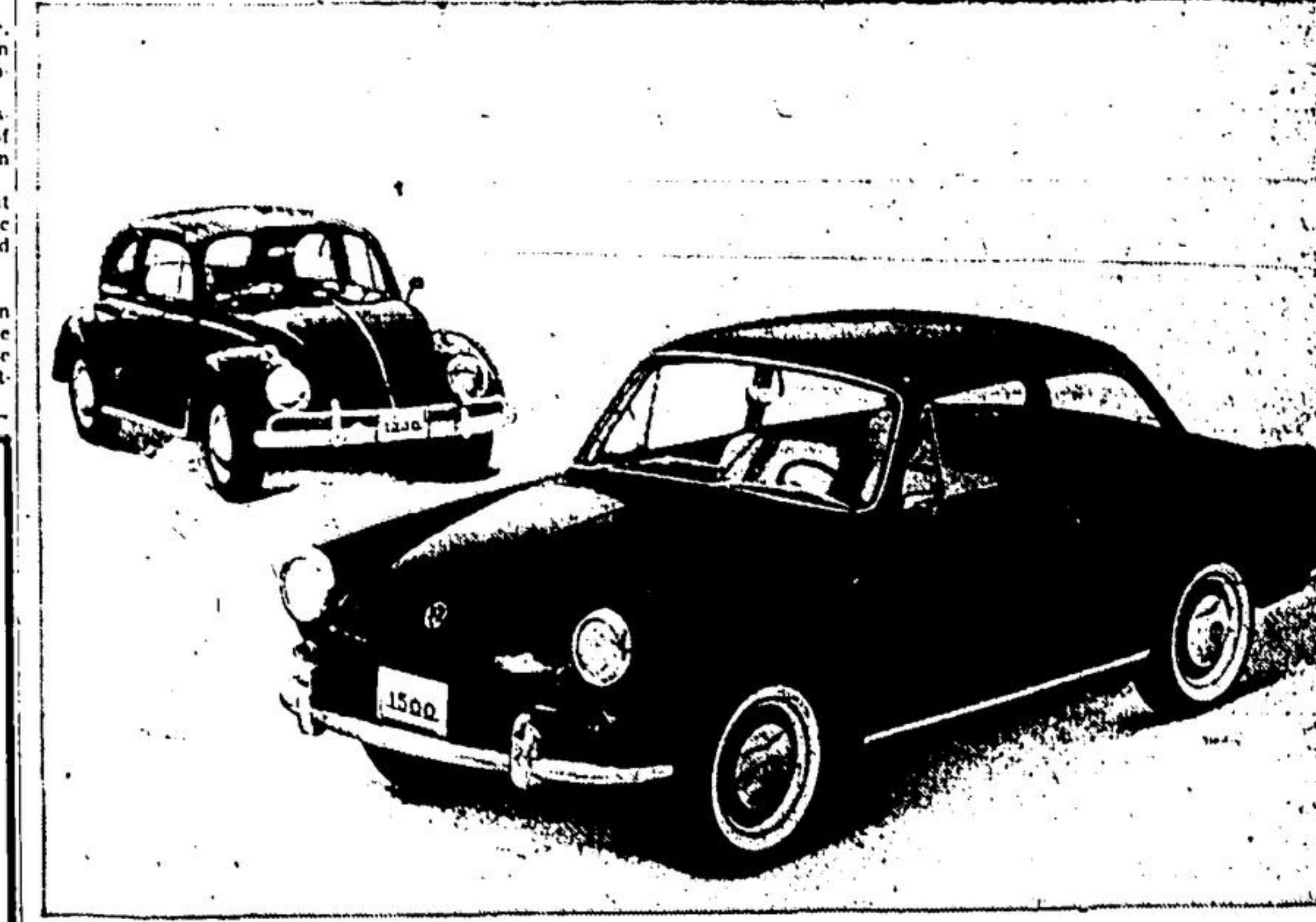
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
