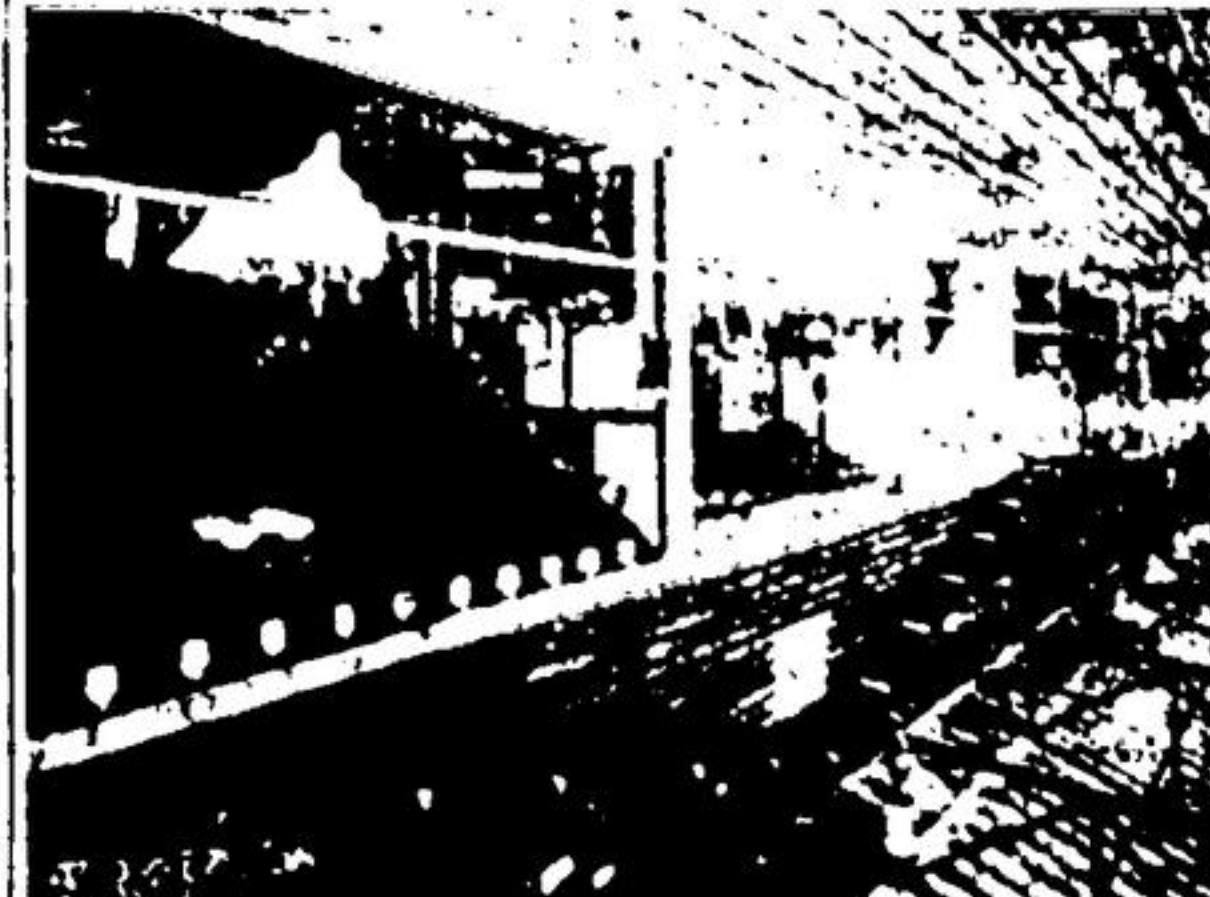

ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES AND EQUIPMENT have altered in appearance and variety over the past half-century as radically as automobiles and feminine fashions. In 1912 Ontario Hydro pioneers set up the first Commission exhibit in the old Process building at Toronto's Canadian National Exhibition. In a three room model cottage (partially visible in the accompanying photograph) which formed part of the initial exhibit, they displayed the relatively few electrical household servants on the market at that time. A comparison of these modest home appliances with the streamlined efficient models in the Commission's exhibit in the new 'Better Living Centre' at the 1962 CNE, demonstrates the remarkable improvements and changes in the electrical appliance field in the 50-year period.

IT'S A BY-LAW

Legal Game from Georgetown records dating back to 1865. Did you know: It is against a bylaw on the town books to wheel baby carriages, strollers, shopping carts or any such vehicles, or walk the dog on any street in Georgetown, and in fact Junior, when he rides his tricycle on the sidewalk outside his home is breaking the law.

By-law No. 120 passed on August 10th, 1883, states — Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Georgetown in council assembled that on or after the passing of this by-law no person shall lead, ride or drive any horse or any other animal along or across any sidewalk, or use the sidewalk for wheelbarrows, handcarts, sleighs, velocipedes, bicycles or tricycles, pedometers, hoops or ANY OTHER CONTRIVANCE, vehicle, or machine.

In the nature or form of a vehicle that would in any wise have a tendency to impede or endanger any pedestrian in the free use of the sidewalks, or at any time or under any circumstances whatever occupy any position of the sidewalks. Offenders on conviction shall be required to pay a fine not less than ten nor more than twenty dollars. Or be jailed by a Justice or Judge for a period not exceeding three days.
