A goodly number of Halton County Liberals attended the Ontario Liberal Association Convention at the Royal York Hotel in Toronto on Friday and Saturday of last week. Dr. Harry Harley, M.P., headed a delegation of Haltonians which included Garfield McGilvray, president of the local organization, Maurice Manderson, Q.C., Halton County president Douglas Fendley, Robert McNeill and Claude Kewley of Georgetown, county vice-president Perry Nelson and Mrs. Nelson, county secretary Miss Sally Davis and Mr. and Mrs. George Baul, Mr. and Mrs. Bob Blake, county organizer and Fred Venton of Oakville; Mayor and Mrs. Owen

Mullin of Burlington; Peter Pilon of Acton; Ken Dick and Joe Hendricks, Milton and Lorne Bird of Esqueping. The convention which was attended by many hundred Ontario Liberals, endorsed the far-reaching program now being offered by their leader, the Hon. John Wintermeyer, Q.C. The Ontario Liberal platform will introduce medicare, an educational program that will peg educational costs to municipal and standardized education in the province and deal with a minimum wage for industry. Never in the history of Ontario Liberalism has such a large convention been held. Halton Liberals will hold a convention in Milton next month when a provincial candidate will be chosen.
