**300,000 Cu. Feet Daily

With an ear-splitting roar, the orange flame shot up in the sky from a gas well on the George Leslie farm at the dusk and fourth lines Saturday afternoon, again vindicating the faith of Tony Seynuk, who 35 years ago started gas and oil explorations, in the face of ill concealed derision from friend and enemy alike.

All heads were tilted backwards as driller Lorne McKillop climbed the 50 ft. ladder to light the burner, for the demonstration. Then, on reaching the ground again, he opened the valve sending the flame shooting high out of the long pipe. Immediately the spectators felt the heat waves beating down on them.
