The present plastics building will provide room for expansion of the facilities of Plax Canada, in anticipation of an increase in the market for plastic containers. It is expected the existing buildings will be occupied in mid-November.

As Tourist Mecca Seek Historic Mill

A three man committee of county council will try to save the flour mill known as Martin's mill in Milton as a relic of the past. The mill has been bought by Robin Hood Flour and they plan to cease operations there. In conjunction with the Museum Board, an effort is being made to keep it operating as a tourist attraction.

However, the mill, its pond, and 35 acres of land would have to be bought together. Consultation with the 16 Mile Creek Authority, and the town of Milton will follow in the hope of acquiring the site as a park, conservation area and museum piece.

This water driven mill was one of the first buildings in Milton.

Post Office Caretaker Veteran of First War

Caretaker of the Georgetown post office for 12 years and prior to that employed with the R. H. Thompson plumbing firm, Alfred Rolfe died at Georgetown & District Hospital on Oct. 16th in his 70th year.

Mr Rolfe was born in England, the son of Fred Rolfe and Emily Barley, and came to Canada in 1918. He enlisted in the 4th Highlanders and served overseas in World War I. He was a member of the Canadian Legion.

Mr Rolfe was twice married. His first marriage took place in Georgetown in 1918 to Ethel Stull and they resided in Hamilton until 1941, prior to moving back to Georgetown following her death in 1953. Mr Rolfe married Florence Ellen Heather of England, who survives him, with a son, Frank Rolfe of R. R. Hespeler, and three grandchildren, Ted, Bob and Marilyn.

Also surviving are one sister, Ethel, Mrs. N. Dunt Lovell, and six brothers, Fred in England, Perry, Copetown, John of Burlington, and Walter, Victor and Arthur, Hamilton. Two sisters and two brothers predeceased him, Annie and Emily, England, and Sidney and Bert, Hamilton.

Mr. and Mrs. A. Himes are visiting in Montreal for a week. Rev. Ian Fleming of St. John's United Church conducted the funeral service at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home on Thursday afternoon and the pallbearers were Legion members Dave Bosman, Perc Chaplin, Jim Yates, Bud Hill, Jim Dabbie and Fred Armstrong. J. Layton acted as one of the flower bearers. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

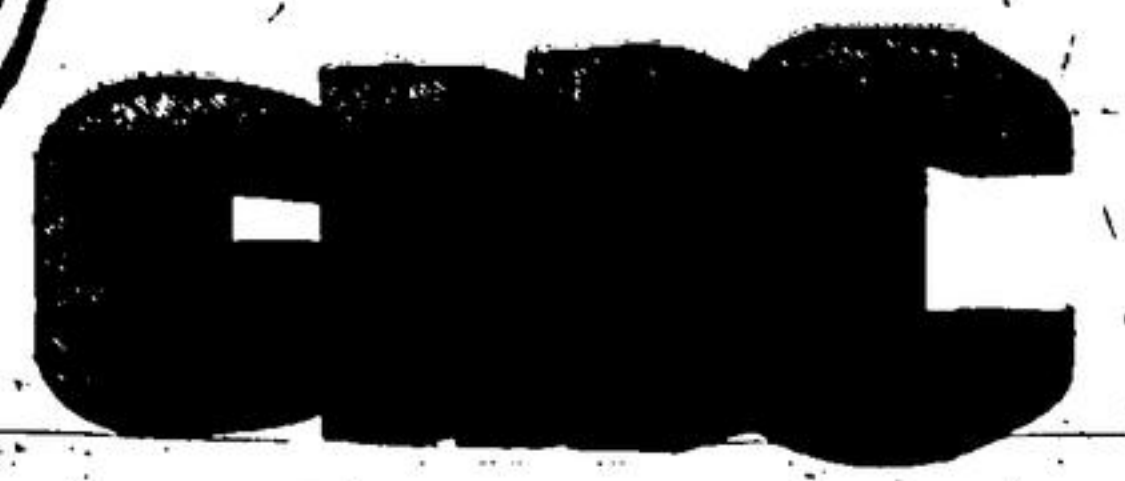
