Council Meets for Last Time in Historic Site

At the last meeting of Halton County Council to be held in the Milton Court House, their home for a hundred years, a full attendance of county councillors was attained for the first time this year, at last week's meeting. The next meeting will be held Nov. 20th in the new building on the first line of Esplanade Township.

This was the first appearance of Reeve Irving Ryckman of Burlington, who was severely injured in an automobile accident last year, but now has recovered sufficiently to attend.

Planning for the official opening of the new building on Nov. 17th was completed, and the actual moving of staff and equipment will take place October 27th.

The Saturday opening will see only invited guests attending the ribbon cutting ceremony by Warden C. A. Martin of Milton, but on Sunday the general public is invited to tour the new structure. After a luncheon at the Milton Inn, the guests will proceed to the court house, where the Lorne Scots military band will play till the 2:30 ribbon cutting ceremony, and following it.

In keeping with the wishes of the late Warden W. Bird, the Warden's Dinner this year will be held in Esplanade, at the Riviera, on Thursday, November 29th.

Night School Resumes Classes at High School

Tuesday, Oct. 16th saw the resumption of night school classes at Georgetown High School, after widespread belief that the classes had been cancelled completely.

However, the classes which had been sponsored by the Night School Committee were the only ones cancelled due to lack of public interest when public meetings were advertised. The classes which had been, and still are sponsored by the Georgetown High School Board are continuing. These are in the main academic subjects.

The subjects offered are: Children's Clothing by Mrs. H. Moss, Physical Fitness - Women, by Mrs. W. Thompson, O. Kokiminen, Electricity I, and Oil Painting by Mr. F. Black.

Two classes have been dropped because of too few registrations. The fees are \$10 for the 19 week courses and \$6 for the 12 week ones.

Tuesday and Wednesday nights are the dates of the Mr. B. Armstrong, Dressmaking classes.

Zorge Firm Gets Contract For New Caledon Hall

A Georgetown construction company, Zorge Construction, come from the sale of the Caledon Telephone system to the Bell Telephone Company for \$46,000.

Zorge's bid to do the job for \$70,000, was the lowest of 13 submitted.

Work on the project will begin almost immediately and contract calls for its completion by May 1st, 1963. The building will be erected on a two acre site north of Caledon Fair grounds. The municipal offices will be in the upper storey, and a hall, stage and washrooms downstairs.

Most of the money used to construct the building will come from the sale of the Caledon Telephone system to the Bell Telephone Company for \$46,000.
