**Terms Separate School  
 Editorial Irrational**

Dear Sir:  
 With amazement I read the  
 emotional outburst against the  
 Ontario Roman Catholic Bus-  
 ops' brief on Education on the  
 editorial page of the Geor-  
 getown Herald of Nov. 1st, 1962.

It is obvious that the editor  
 does not have a full apprecia-  
 tion of the contents of the ab-  
 ove mentioned document dur-  
 ing a "blind" irrational bias,  
 which is clearly illustrated by  
 the emotional terms of the ed-  
 itorial. Expressions like

"Current agitation by Roman  
 Catholics" and "to put its foot  
 down once and for all on this  
 whole separate school matter"

demontstrate an immature un-  
 derstanding of the moral and  
 constitutional rights of the Se-  
 parate School and of the dem-  
 ocratic principle of govern-  
 ment in this country, in which  
 every person is free and equal  
 in dignity and rights without  
 regard to race, creed, color,  
 nationality and ancestry of ori-  
 gin (Ontario Human Rights  
 Code, 1962).

Religion is not only some-  
 thing you do before and after  
 a meal or during one hour on  
 Sunday.

I have no objections against  
 any constructive criticism or  
 comment, but I feel that irra-  
 tional outbursts such as this ed-  
 itorial, do not fit our democra-  
 tic society. I like to empha-  
 size, that it is the normal way  
 of expression in dictatorial  
 states. It disturbs the harmony  
 among the groups which form  
 our communities.

It is not clear who the "we"  
 are in the editorial. Is it Mr.  
 W. C. Birn or is it the Home  
 Newspaper Ltd? I cannot be-  
 lieve that the Georgetown Her-  
 ald advocates the irresponsible  
 attitude expressed in this ed-  
 itorial.

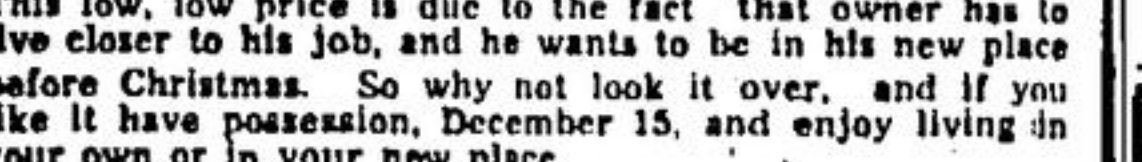
