## Raiders Win Pair to

### Start Bright Season

A Raider hockey team that many customers doubted could get off the ground in the revitalized Central Ontario Hockey League, considering their losses, blasted into orbit on the weekend and their officials are smugly assuring the doubters that everything is A-OK.

They lifted off with a 53 triumph over Dundas in front of 700 backers here Friday night, as expected. But left the league "experts" open mouthed by bouncing the Ontario Intermediate Champions, Port Colborne, 9-6, in the canals town Sunday afternoon.

While they are putting each other on the back with one hand club execs are groping for the recommended reserves with the other. Two former Macedonians, Bob Burns, and Whitley Youngberg are trading phone conversations with Raiders, and a third Stu McNeil, late of the Detroit Red Wings, is willing to join Scotty Patterson's brigade but may not be able to do so technically.

Car Vesey, who lashed on Basemant and Gord Thompson in the last session from the Call, 14:45 to make 1-0, and passed him to Dave Irons for Georgetown's case, already stronger by the second score four minutes later.

Blair Constantine from Mc Dougald and Collins put Dundas on the sheet after a minute.

Granted it is a stubby led and 54 seconds of the middle period. But Raiders are sitting up there above the second place screen in. Mac Galand one

blasted the crowd to breath a little easier by recapturing the two past spread soon after Dundas had fallen. Lucyban and Blackie Graham started the attack and Galand cracked by a couple of shots to defenders to trigger the shot in the short side.

Whims from Knight and Landry at 11:00 made it 3-2. But big Gord Thompson, who turned sniper for the night, gollied one from just inside the blue line, found a channel to the back of the new butterfly net at 13:10. With five seconds to go in the period Lauder became the third to beat Cameron. He got help from Knight and Cyril.

In the last frame both clubs maintained their fast pace, normal for the first just, but referees dulled by the six men in the layoff cost both sure goals in the final minute with Dundas chasing the tying goal with six attackers. Gord Thompson found himself in possession of the disc at centre ice and slid his shot dead centre.

Raiders bombed the Ontario champions with 4 goals in the first period, 3 in the second and two in the third in the Sunday matinee in which Mac Galand almost personally devastated the mighty title holders with a five goal peppering.

Mac Zabadiuk and J. D. Cam are real finds. Zabadiuk can bump, instigate a rush, and bump the grey matter as well as any rearguard when he owns the puck. If he's paired with Vasy, Raiders will have a potent duo.

Cameron won his job, and ousted Alfie Tritts with sharp goal tending in the Raiders' limited practice sessions under real pressure. He was just as alert and handled Dundas' val

ous like he had just had his nerves removed.
