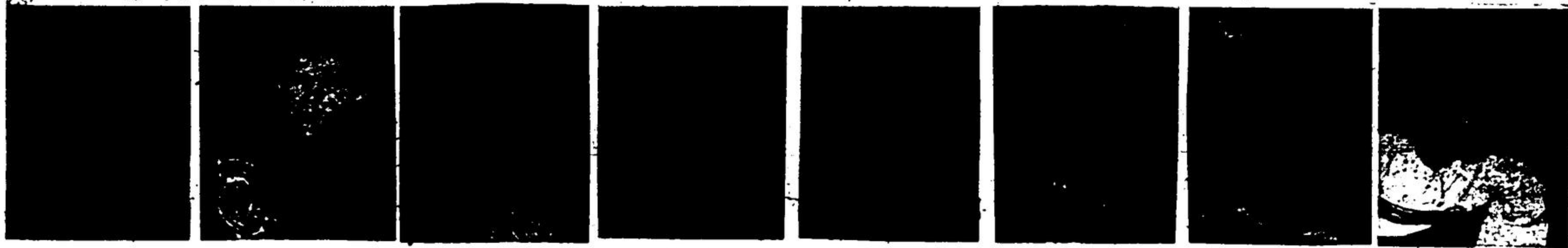


MINOR HOCKEY WILL WIN WHEN N.H.L. OLDTIMERS PLAY RAIDERS

Ken Morrow back in the line-up looked real good, scoring a goal and assisting on 3 others. Jack Heppes also played good hockey. Georgetown scoring, Ken Morrow, Mac Korzak, 2, Jack Heppes 2 and Jack Gudgoun. Oakville scoring Grime, Crack, Vallincourt, and Mac Roe. Thursday, Nov. 22 (tonight) will be a real test for the local time. Guelph comes to town with an unbeaten record, and Georgetown is also undefeated. Reports have it that Guelph is the team to beat.

Fan support has not been good. It is felt that if the hockey fans would take a Thursday night to watch these kids they would become steady juvenile followers. Raiders Overtake Oaks Win Fifth of Season

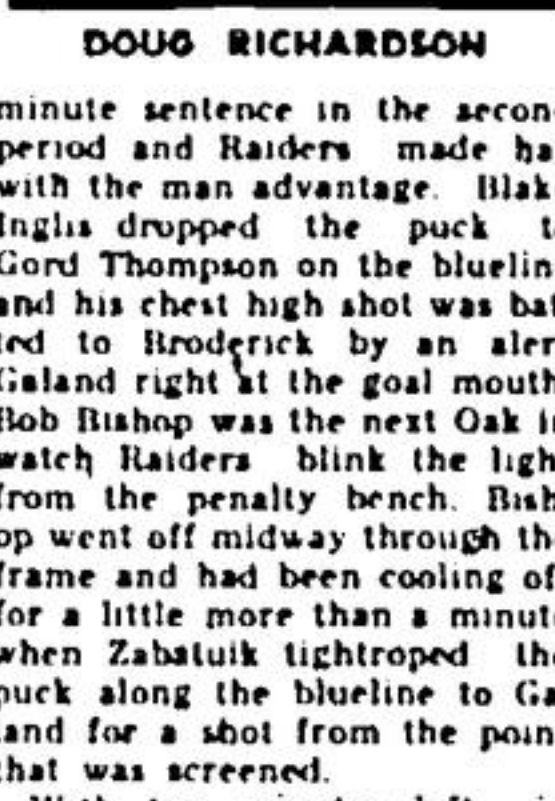
Oakville Oaks, who have just voted themselves the tough luck team for 1962, had two points under the black and gold belts and a sweet-tasting triumph over Georgetown's amazing Raiders when they tripped over a couple of Hockey fundamentals half way through the final period and fumbled a sure win here Friday night.

Georgetown won the game 5-4 and stayed unbeaten. The miffed Oaks had a legit reason for applying the hard luck label. How were Bill Ford's troops to know they would encounter the Raiders while Scotty Paterson was showing the assembled 700 the basics of the power play, and penalty killing. Combined the lessons tant Oakville home shaking their collective heads and mumbling something about 'lucky stiffs', presumably meant for Mac Gal and who beat Len Broderick 4 times and Doug Richardson and Wayne Thompson, who used Oaks top guns as their stooges for their timely checking lesson.

A third bit of unscheduled instruction came out of a mace. A good defensive team can frustrate a good offensive aggregation. Man for man the Oaks have the top crop of potential scorers in the COHL, but against good checkers like Richardson and Thompson, and defencemen like Mac Zababuk, Carry Ingle, Wely Magdy and Gord Thompson they can appear almost human. And Raiders are still to use Gar Vasey, possibly their number-1 rearguard. Oakville owned a 2-1 lead at the end of the first period and were still in front 4-3 at the end of two. Barry Smith blanked them in the third while his trigger men salvaged the game. The Oaks drew first blood when Jack Rogers raked in Bob Bishop's pass and threaded an opening between Smith and the pipe before the customers had settled in their seats. Bob Hawkins got the gate moments later, and been inside the box for exactly one second when Raiders scored from the face-off to equal things. Half the crowd didn't catch the lightning quick play on which Blake Ingles shot a pass to Galand, who took it and whipped it in. In one motion Jack Price put the Oaks back into their lead before the period was half over with his first counter against Raiders this season. Assistants came from Jack Rogers and former Oakville great who rejoined his old club this year, Norm Slick.
