Four Accidents In District

North Hallow Provincial Police investigated four accidents in the Georgetown area over the past week.

On Wednesday, Nov. 14th, Frank Herbert Johnson of Erin was uninjured when his car left the road near Stewarttown above 15 side road and clipped off a hydro pole. Damage to the car was negligible, but it will cost \$200 to replace the pole. Cpl. Joe Veldcamp made the investigation.

On the evening of the 14th a car driven by Vice Edward Decort of R.R. 4, Brampton veered off the east side of the town line above Hurval and smashed two Department of Highways signs valued at \$40. Decort's car, a 1958 Studebaker received about \$200 damage.

Myrtle Marie James of T. McNabb St., Georgetown, suffered scrapes and bruises when the car she was driving was involved in an accident Thursday. The car received an estimated \$150 damage. The accident happened 1/4 mile south of Ashgrove on the 7th line, but details were not available from the OPP.

Former District Farmer Killed in Motor Crash

Thomas Ferguson Macdonald, 79, of Brampton, was killed in a car-truck collision on Friday at the Sandhill Rd. and Sixth Line East. Truck driver Ernest Bryant of Guelph was uninjured.

Mr. Macdonald had farmed in Chinguacousy Township for most of his life, moving to Brampton in 1947. He was an agent for Co-Operators Insurance Association. He was ordained an elder of Union Presbyterian Church in 1957 and later served as an elder in the Brampton Presbyterian Church. He leaves his wife, the former Eva Owens, his family, Eleanor, Mrs. A. H. McKane (Margaret), Owens and Fraser, grandchildren Murray and Dianne McKane, Iowan and Gwen Dolyn Macdonald, and a brother, Fraser, of Vancouver, B.C. He was the youngest son of John and Margaret Macdonald and his brothers John, Hugh, David and Andrew predeceased him.

Funeral service was conducted Monday by the Rev. John McLellan at the McKillop Funeral Home, Brampton. Pallbearers were Duncan Macdonald, Arthur Macdonald, Jack Macdonald, Terry Anderson, La Verne Thompson and Donald Garbutt. Interment was in the Brampton Cemetery.
