



- . Q. Are you appared to spending manay en the reads in the Delrex area?
- A. This impression arises from vicious prepaganda. In 1961 when I was Mayer, more maney was spant on read surfacing in the Delrex area than in any previous year. We spent almost \$50,000, and this is double the amount the precent Council spent this year. I am appased to relieving the Devaloper from his obligations because this in turn is an added burden to YOU the tax-
- O. Would you do any more read surfacing. in Delrex.
- A. Yes, in 1961, as I stated, we did spand almost \$50,000 on surfacing and made plans to complete this in 1962. However, nothing was done in 1962, so it must be completed mext year.
- Q. If this year's Council could not afford to finish this surfacing, how can you promise this?
- A. Essentiale should come first, this year many frills were placed first on the list, particularly if these frills were made of concrete. Enough meney was spent foolishly and mysteriously to have kad these reads completed.
- Q. What would you do about Guelph \$17 A. The condition is deplorable, however feel this must be done on a 3 year plan.

- e Q. Why do you say a 3 year program?
- A. I feel it must be dans out at current funds and not added to our Debanture Dabt.
- @ Q. What is our Delanture Delay
- A. Almest three and a half million
- . Q. Can all of the Debanture Dabl he attributed to Dairex Developments and recent Councile?

A. No. Some of it was caused by Council's in the 1930's and 1940's when the taxes were kept down at the expense of improvement. Sema of it was caused by 1950's Council's when they did many of these necessary improvements on barrowed capital rether then current capital.

. Q. Many of the Consdidates have stated they would stop the bickering that is going on. A great deal of the blame is laid at your decretes. Why?

A. As long as Councils from 1954 enwards went clong with any proposal that the Davelegar precented, regardless of the cansaquances to the general ratepayer, there was no bickering. The bickering started when same of us took a more realistic approach to our precent troubles and said 'NO' to further residential land release. Most of the bickering will step If the Leader, which is the mouthpiece for a privately awned dovelepament company, is stopped. Another solution to stop the bickering would be to release all the residential lands and ruin ferever your chances of a realistic value on the hard-earned dellars that you have invested in Georgetown.

- O. Many of the Candidates evaded Quastions on the ratio issue by referring to the decision of the Dept. of Munkipsi Affairs. Do you think it was preser to submit this to the D.M.A.
- A. On September 10th, 1962, I, and three members of the present council met with the Deputy Minister of Municipal Affairs in Tarante an an unafficial visit, and as a result the matien to present this problem to the D.M.A. was presented to Council.
- . Q. Do you feel all of the Candidates are shawing their true celsure and taking an kanest stand in this election?

A. 
