Dear Mr. Editor:

But mine is not a convenient conscience. I can not turn it off when it bothers me. Therefore I feel that I must speak out.

Too many of our citizens, I fear, take the same attitude as Mr. K. The sin is not in doing evil, but in being found out.

Dear Decoration:

It may be a simple door decoration based upon a wreath or cluster of evergreen twigs, or, it may be a general outdoor lighting installation to enhance the pleasing features of a house, lawn or planting. In any case, certain safety precautions should be taken such as to have the proper type of extension cord and connections for outdoor work.

**WHAT COUNCIL DID**

**Says Taking Action  
Filling Water Holes**

Filling of water holes in the Lane subdivision is in process, council was told Nov. 22th in a letter from solicitor Terry Baines representing Bob Lane and Credit Vie & Developments. Council through its solicitor had last week taken action under a new by-law to force elimination of a claimed hazard. Mr. Baines' letter said Mr. Lane had deposited fill, secured from the CNR, at the sanitary land fill site but when his town garbage contract terminated, he had been prevented by the police department "under instructions from Cr. Harrison" from removing it.

This brought Cr. Harrison to his feet with the charge that no permission had been given to store fill on town property and anything at the disposal site belongs to the town.

Cr. McNelly opined that the town could put a counter claim against Mr. Lane "that would not hurt him a lot more than the fill he thinks he is entitled to." At this stage Mayor Sargent halted the discussion with the advice that the town solicitor had been instructed to take steps and it should be left in his hands.
