### Says Town Treasurer Should Be Accountant

A town treasurer with chartered accountant qualifications and office administration experience was strongly recommended to council last week by auditor Walter Pope. Mr. Pope was engaged by council several weeks ago to make an administration survey and recommendations and to implement any improvements in the town offices which council might endorse. Mr. Pope told council that without a qualified treasurer, the value of accounting machinery which the town bought a year ago is lost. He stressed that his recommendation cast no reflections on present staff.

"The fundamental problem is that the present staff has increased over a period of time as the town grew and that a chain of authority is lacking and duties are not clearly marked for individual staff members," he said. "If we get more work from hospital employees," he observed. The report is to be studied by councilors for discussion and decision later.

### Cancel Enquiry, Pay Expenses Asks Engineer Geoffery Bligh

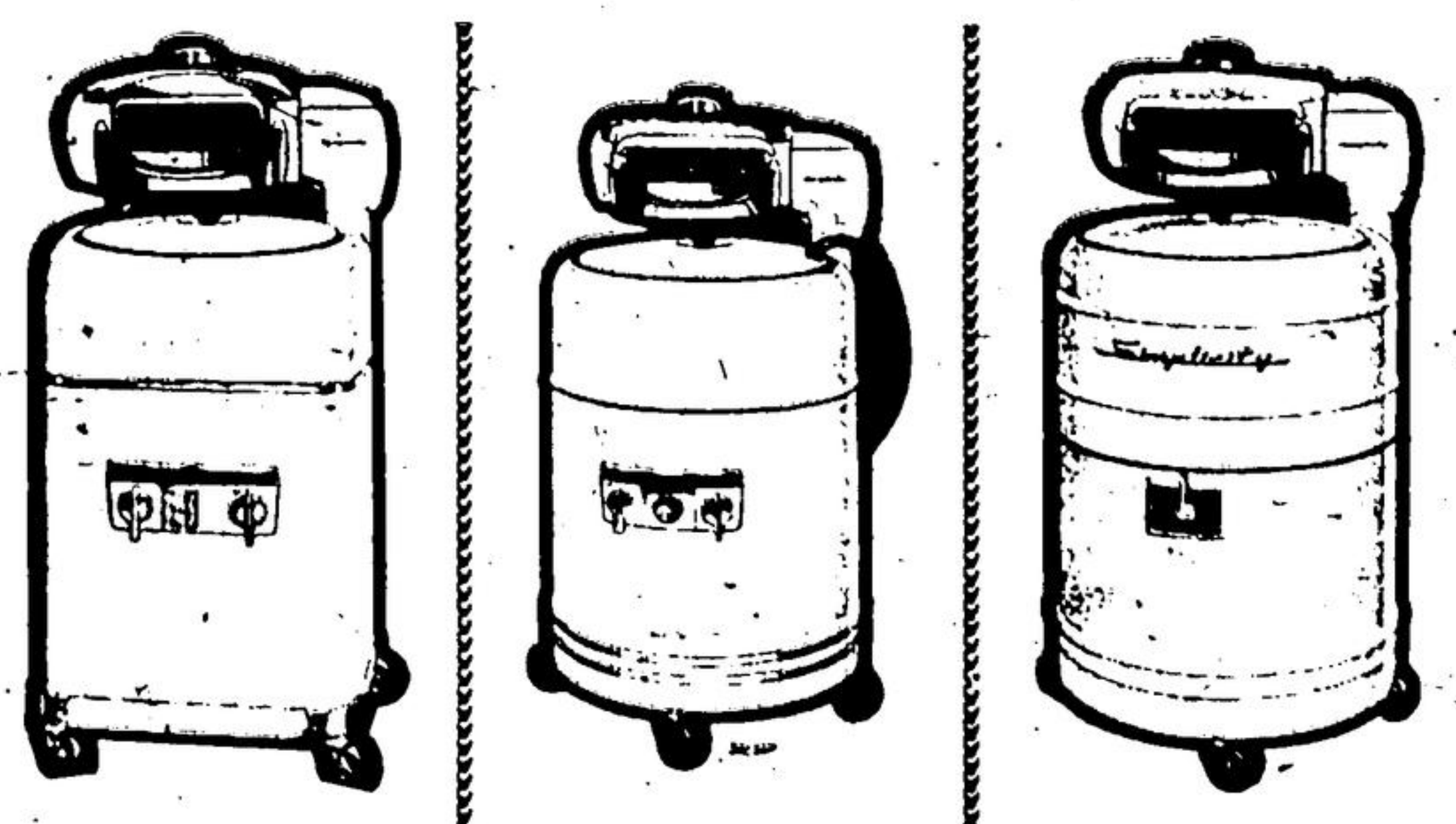
