

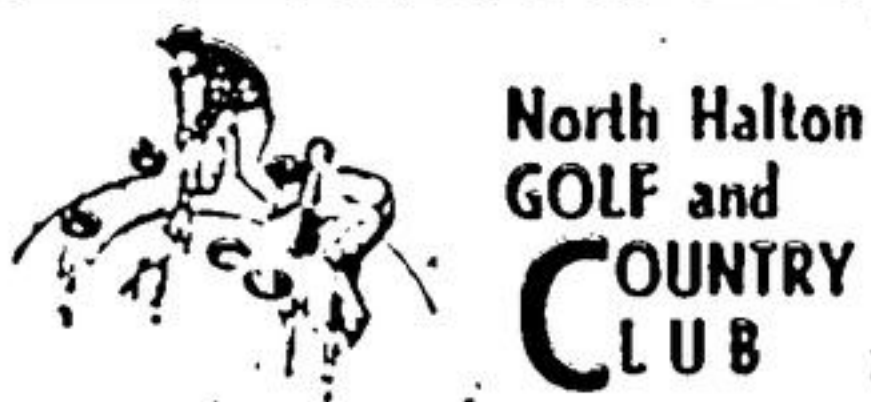


MAX STAFFORD 'MOST VALUABLE' BASEBALLER
