The evening was arranged by the Extension Branch of the Ont. Dept. of Agriculture, and the Halton 4-H Club Leaders' Council. The Club awards were presented under the direction of J. Douglas Burnside, Assistant Agricultural Representative in Halton.

J. Allen Francis, agricultural representative in Halton, outlined the contribution of volunteer leaders to the 4-H Club program, and announced the 1962 Club year as a record for number of members completing 4-H Clubs in Halton. 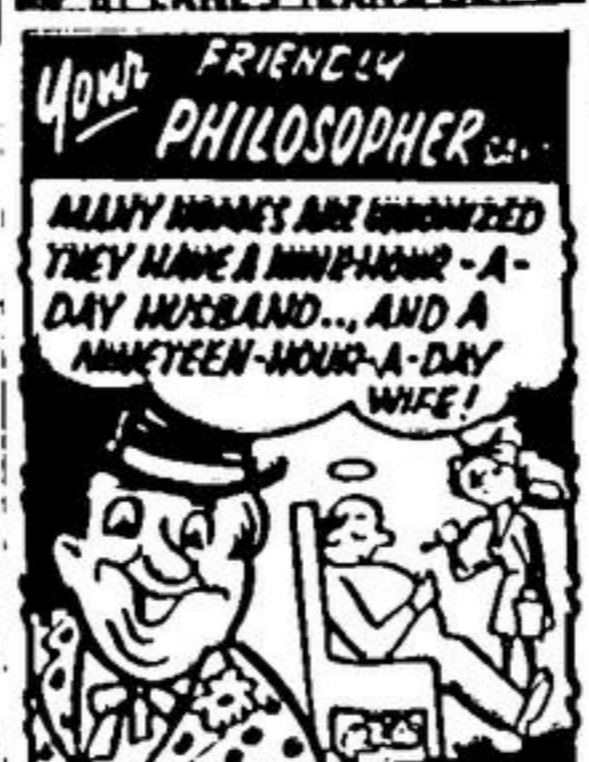
