At a meeting in Harrison Public School last Wednesday the Georgetown Public School Board:

- Approved a request from the principal's association to again have the children bring White Gifts for distribution from the Toronto Missions.
- Read a request from High School principal J. L. Lambert for an opportunity to explain what the high school had to offer in the Roberts Plan to grades seven and eight.
- Granted use of Wigglesworth auditorium to the Y for square dancing classes.
- Accepted with regret the resignation of Mrs. Heather Thompson from the teaching staff.
- Decided to write to council regarding the unusually large number of dogs in the vicinity of schools and in the yards while the children are at recess.
- Welcomed trustees-elect Malcolm Freeman and John Wolfe to the meeting, and expressed hope that they would find their work interesting and be able to make their term profitable to the community.
- Set Wednesday, January 2 as the date for the 1963 inaugural meeting.
- Expressed their appreciation to retiring members Roger Wadg and Don Powers for their services during the past year, and also to the Inspector of Public Schools in this area, O. G. McDowell, who attended the meeting.
