In Scandinavian countries even the poor save coins to buy sheaves of wheat and barley and bits of suet to place on roofs or trees for the birds. St. Francis of Assisi gave extra food to domestic animals because he wanted all creation to share in the joy of the season.

Police Crack Down On Drinking Drivers

Sgt. Charles Wilkinson of the North Halton detachment OPP told the Herald today that the Commission has ordered all OPP detachments to crack down on drinking drivers. Sgt. Wilkinson said that drivers could regard this as forewarning from his detachment that any one in this part of the county who takes the wheel with his alertness impaired in the slightest by drink will be treated to the severest extent of the law. He said all personnel have had their leaves cancelled and road patrols will be doubled until the holiday season is over.

War Declared On Gas Prices

War has been declared. But it's nothing to get panicky about since this particular form of warfare is becoming as casual as snow and coloured lights. Local gas stations are dropping their prices. The same thing happened last year and the year before that. At writing time the price of a gallon of regular gas stood at 35¢ and threatened to dip lower. Last year in a survey of opinions some station operators blamed all companies for the price slacking, others blamed other operators for trying to cheat customers. Motorists did not particularly care how it got started, just so long as it lasted.
