Six Handy Hints For Tree Safety

Six handy hints for the installation and maintenance of Christmas trees have been issued this year by the Halton Fire Prevention Bureau.

Through the local fire department, the Bureau has distributed 30,000 Christmas tree safety tags to tree dealers throughout the County. Dealers have given excellent cooperation and are placing the tags (which often double as a price tag) on every tree going into local homes.

There are many precautions you can take to keep the Christmas tree from becoming a fire hazard, but the Bureau lists the main six — Don't put the tree up until a week before Christmas; Don't place it near an exit or heating appliance; Don't place the tree in a dry container; Don't use other than approved lighting and decorations; Don't leave the tree lights on when you go to bed or leave the house; and Don't use anything but 15 amp fuses in your lighting circuit. "We hope this Christmas will be a fire-free one for every family," said Fire Chief Benfield of the Georgetown Fire Department. "It takes only 18 seconds for fire to reduce a tree to ashes. Let's not take any chances on fire this holiday season."

CHRISTMAS EGG NOG



Christmas is not complete without the traditional egg-nog. Today it is possible to buy egg-nog from the milkman or the corner grocer — or make your own as folks used to do. Here is a typical recipe. Traditional Christmas Egg-nog: 6 eggs, separated; 1 cup sugar; 2 cups light or whipping cream.

2 cups milk; 2 teaspoons salt; 2 teaspoons vanilla; Freshly ground nutmeg; Beat egg yolks and sugar until thick and lemon colored. Beat in cream, milk, salt and vanilla. Beat egg whites until they hold stiff peaks; fold into egg yolk mixture. Serve in chilled punch bowl; sprinkle with nutmeg. Makes 2 1/2 gals.

Favour GHS to Win in Basketball Loop

Georgetown high school basketball team will wear the mantle of favourites for the title when they plunge into the 1962-63 District basketball schedule this week. Both boys' senior and junior dropped a pair of exhibition games to John F. Ross College late of Guelph, but their showings against the acknowledged superior teams gave the coaches, Lynn McLaren of the Seniors and Gerry Thompson of the Juniors, a rosy outlook on their faring in the District loop which included Acton, Milton and GHS.

Last week the Juniors forced John F. Ross into an overtime period before relinquishing a 26-22 win, and the Seniors gave their counterparts just about as rough a time before bowing 51-42. Monday night on Guelph's hour ground the J.F.R.'s class and height carried them to an easy double leader sweep 73-40 in Senior action, and 53-38 in Junior. Graduation took only two of the first string Seniors, Tony Crisma and George Smith, and Lynn McLaren has had lots of material to work with in plugging the holes. Jeff Nurse and Luck Smith are up from the Junior ranks. Al Marchand, Bob Harris and Don Chisholm are working out with the team, and another potential first stringer, Paul Kilbense, has returned to the game after not playing for a year.
