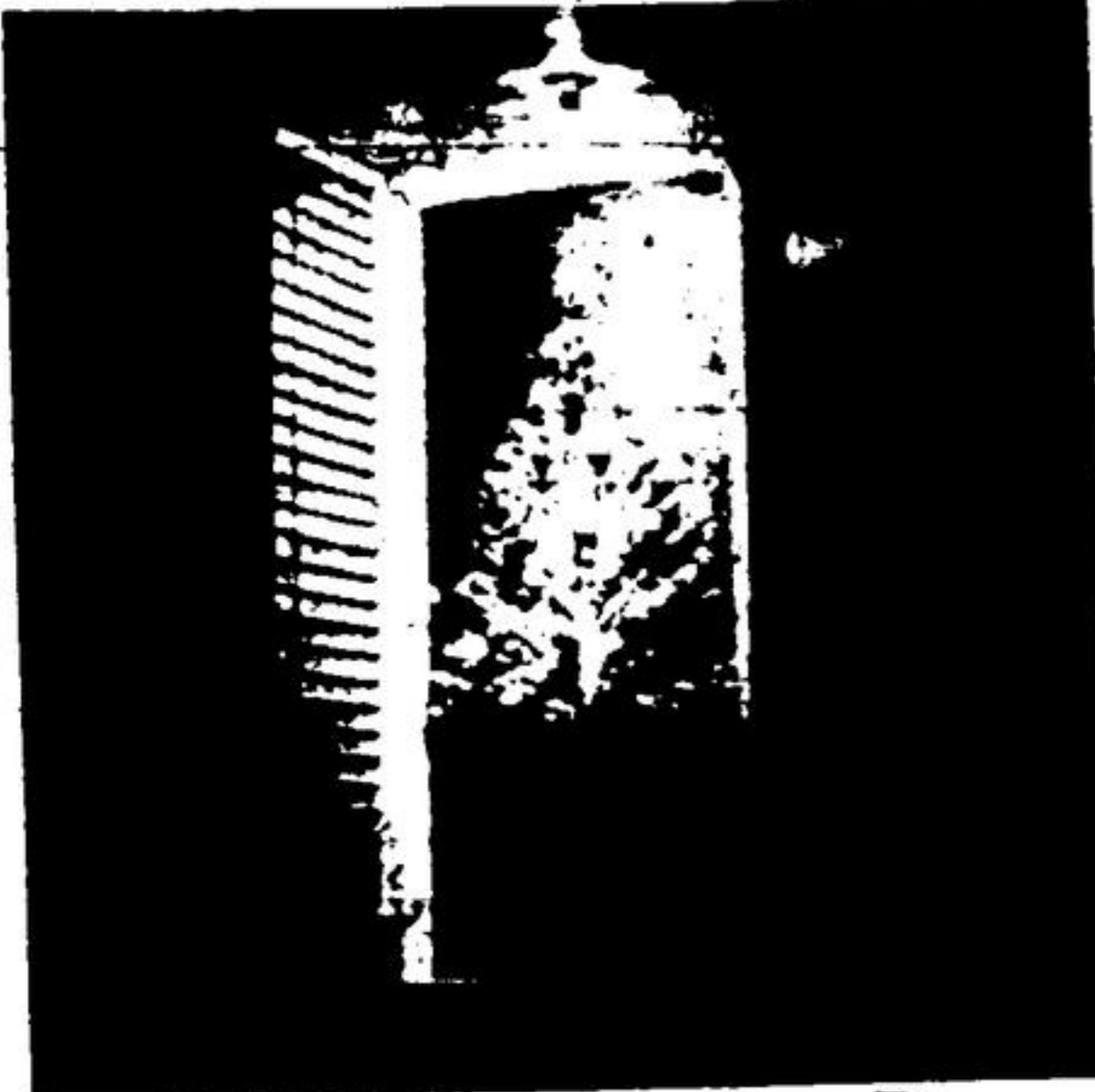




# Christmas Services in the Churches

## DISTRICT NEWS AT A GLANCE

### BURLINGTON

Tuesday afternoon Burlington Mayor Owen Mullin sat at the controls of a giant bulldozer and of ferally broke the first ground of Tadnash Golf & Country Club, Burlington's new championship-length 18 hole golf course on up per Brant Street.

### STREETSVILLE

Streetsville is the latest community to have its industrial picture brightened by the addition of a new company. A cement manufacturing plant is in the cards for 1963 it was revealed this week. Standard Paving is buying property in Streetsville because "of the great potential growth there" according to the firm's vice president.

### TORONTO TOWNSHIP

Opposition to Toronto Township's plan for unification of its school system and hydro is based on "a negative approach to the problem" according to the reverend Robert Speck. Opposition has come from Central Peel High School Board, from Toronto Twp and from a section of Streetsville officialdom.

### BRAMPTON

Lawyer Russell Prouse pulled the rug from under the four year reign of Mayor Carman Core last week by a 750 vote majority. Final tallies showed Mr. Prouse captured 2,979 votes to Mr. Core's 2,220. Less than half of the town's voters went to the polls.

### GUELPH

The development of a major university within commuting distance of Guelph has created a new educational opportunity for the young people of this area. More than 400 businessmen and community leaders in Ontario and Quebec are serving as volunteer canvassers in a campaign to raise funds to enable this new Waterloo University to complete its basic canvas.

### ORANGEVILLE

An experiment caused young Linda Bryan a lot of discomfort Tuesday. On her way to school the 9 year old put her tongue on the frosty railing of a bridge and was immediately stuck fast. A catering service driver heard the cries of her schoolmates and used hot coffee to free the girl. She lost much of the skin off her tongue in her struggles.

### BOLTON

It may soon be illegal to discharge firearms in Vaughan Township because of another case of mistaken identity. A hunter scouring the bush near here last week saw an animal through the trees, look careful, aim and slew a cow feeding at a trough on the farm of Horace Fraser. Council will soon finalize reading of a by-law which will place a ban on firearms. The regretful part is that good hunters, usually members of Hunting and Angling clubs, suffer from the careless pseudo-sportsman.
