Ambridge to Retire As Abitibi President

(Toronto) Douglas W. Ambridge will become Chairman of the Board and Paul E. Roberts, President and Chief Executive Officer effective February 1, 1963, according to an announcement made following a meeting of the Board of Directors of Abitibi Power & Paper Company, Limited, Abitibi is the parent company of Provincial Paper.

Mr. Ambridge first joined Abitibi in 1923 and since that time his business career has been devoted to the pulp and paper industry. After an absence of many years, four of which were in the service of the Department of Munitions and Supply during the last war, he rejoined Abitibi in 1948 as President. He is a Director of the Royal Bank of Canada, Montreal Trust Company, Canada Steamship Lines, Limited and several other important Canadian companies. He is a member of the Board of Governors of McGill University, Board of Trustees, Toronto General Hospital, and is the President of the Canadian Heart Foundation. Mr. Ambridge holds an honorary degree from Waterloo Lutheran University.

Mr. Roberts joined Abitibi in 1949 as Manager of New Developments and a member of the Management Committee. In 1953 he was appointed Vice President and General Manager of Alaska Pine and Cellulose Limited and a member of the Board of Directors of that company in which Abitibi had a large interest. He returned to Abitibi in October, 1955 as Vice President and was responsible for the development of Abitibi Corporation, Alpena, Michigan, in June, 1959, he was appointed Executive Vice President and elected to Abitibi's Board of Directors on October 11, 1961. Mr. Roberts is a Past Chairman of the Western Section Canadian Pulp & Paper Association.
