

## Jury Recommends Signs After Sideroad Accident

Signs indicating obstructed vision should be erected on either side of the hill where Ernest Baitkin of Georgetown was killed in a car accident Nov. 20, a coroner's jury rec-

ommended at an inquest into his death held at the Halton Court House, Tuesday evening, Dec. 11th.

M. Baitkin had served as secretary-treasurer of the Esqueving Township school area board for the past six years. He was driving to Speyside School on November 20th to investigate a break-in when his car met one driven by Joseph Wagner of Georgetown head on, on 22 Sideroad, Esqueving, a mile east of Highway 25.

After listening to witnesses Joseph Wagner, driver of the other car, constable Wilfred Griffith of North Halton OPP, and Percy Baitkin, brother of the deceased, the jury found that lack of caution by the part of both drivers was the cause of the accident.

**Balk Over**  
Constable Griffith testified that the skid marks of both cars indicated that each driver had been driving about a foot and a half on the wrong side of the road.

Mr. Wagner testified that he had been travelling east on the 22 sideroad when he heard the wailing of the siren and saw another car approaching. He then tried to steer his car into the embankment but it was too late and the two cars collided.

Percy Baitkin appeared on the stand to say if someone could explain how it was possible for his brother to be killed instantly while the other driver escaped with only minor injuries. Dr. C. K. Stevenson in charge of the inquest noted that Mr. Baitkin's age, 73, would be a contributing factor to his instant death.

**Balk Might Help**  
The jury also thought seat belts could possibly have saved Mr. Baitkin's life.

Crown attorney P. K. McWilliams noted that most of us drive too fast on country roads, with a false sense of security. We should make a conscious effort all of the time to stay on the right side of the road and to slow down.
