Prohibits Breadcast

Dr. Harley points out that a rigid interpretation of the two acts as they now exist probiluts a local political broadcast in Vancouver if there is a mu nicipal election being hald in Halifax. As a case in point, be says that one of his own Report from Parliament broad casts was recently cancelled because there was an election being held in Newfoundland.

"My bills would not make any change with respect to fe deral elections as these are general and take place in all ar eas where a broadcast may be made." Dr. Harley explains. "What I am proposing is that the acts be clarified to prohi bit such broadcasts only in areas where they would reach listeners in places where an election is being held."

Maybe Hispal

He points out that a local broadcast from one radio or television station, almed at a particular area in Ontario, is not going to affect a provincial election in Saskatchewan or a municipal election in some other part of Ontario which can not hear the broad-


