Devoted Public Servants

The holidays brought sadness to several local homes when loved ones died.

- Included were two men who had served this community well, one for over forty years in the person of Walter T. Evens and one for a much briefer time, Jim Brown.

. Mr. Evans who founded an insurance. and real estate firm in 1919, was prominent in many phases of Georgetown life. He was a justice of the peace, a United Church elder and past master of the Masonic lodge. And he had served as a member and later secretary of the high school board.

Extremely active until he became illaa few months before his death, he was one of Georgetown's best known and best respec-

Mr. Brown, though a town resident for only six years, had made his mark in a public way by twice being elected a councillor for Ward 3. Georgetown had lost him as a resident since he moved to Waterloo in the late fall where he was operating a tervice station. And it was with deep shock that news of his sudden death from a heart attack was learned the week before Christ-
