**Moves Barber Shop**  
**To New Location**

A Main Street barber shop location for thirty years went out of existence the first of the year when Merv Cook opened a new shop on Edward Street.

The shop, beside the bus stop, has had the familiar red and white pole at its entrance since 1933 when former mayor Joseph Gibbons moved there from farther up the street. Coincidentally it was formerly a Red & White grocery store.

Mr. Cook came to Georgetown in 1939, after barbering for a year each in Kleinburg and Warrton. He first worked for Roy Magloughlin and after serving overseas with the 6th Anti-Tank Battery he returned to town to operate his own shop, first at Hutch's Smoke Shop and then at the shop he has vacated.

Mr. Cook's new shop has been constructed at the rear of his residential property on Normandy Boulevard and fronts on Edward St. just south of the highway.

**Regular Council Meetings**  
**Set Every Monday Night**

Georgetown council will hold regular meetings each Monday night this year.

While weekly meetings have been customary for some time, only the first Monday in the month has been set as a regular meeting and others were termed special meetings.

Mayor Hyde explained Tuesday, when the change was made, that the former procedure protected members on vacation or absent through illness from legislation which could lose a councillor his seat if he missed three regular meetings in a row. Now the Municipal Act has been amended and a councillor is penalized only if he fails to attend meetings for a three month period.

The mayor promised the council will end by 11 p.m. unless there is an extreme situation which requires a meeting longer than three hours.

Council voted to continue a \$2500 annual expense allowance for the mayor. Their own remuneration of \$20 a meeting is established by by-law and requires no yearly endorsement.
