**Halton's Harley Backs Pearson  
Calls Mike a 'Peaceful Man'**

The Liberal stand on nuclear weapons has the unqualified support of Dr. Harry Harley, Liberal member for the Halton federal riding.

Commenting on the speech of the Leader of the Opposition, Lester Pearson, in Scarborough recently, Dr. Harley said there was nothing in the speech he objected to.

"It was a thoughtful speech of a peaceful man who is interested in keeping Canada free and at peace," Dr. Harley said.

"The press emphasized the nuclear aspect. This is important but the remainder of his defence proposals were of equal importance," Dr. Harley continued.

"The speech was obviously precipitated by Canada's need for a defence policy. The Cuban crisis showed Canada really does not have any policy on defence at present."

"Mr. Pearson made some statements which appear to me important but have apparently been glossed over. One quote that struck me was: 'War is evil but not necessarily the weapons of war.'"

Peace is Mr. Pearson's objective of the Liberal Party. But we can make aggression so dangerous that no one dare attack.

"Mr. Pearson states again in his speech that the Liberals oppose individual control of nuclear weapons, since the present government has committed us to the Starfighter, Bomarc and Honest John, however, we should fulfill our commitments without hypocrisy."

"At the same time Mr. Pearson also said we should work for collective control of nuclear weapons through NATO so that no individual country can act on its own."

"The ultimate is to work towards nuclear disarmament on a world wide basis. There are all reasonable policies with which a majority of Canadians would agree."

"The eight points on defence in general contained in Mr. Pearson's speech raise no objection in my mind. Reading the speech I can say I agree with it entirely."

"Only on one small point could I see a great problem. This is the suggestion to fully integrate the army, navy and air force for greater efficiency. I can see a certain amount of difficulty in this. The dentistry, and to a certain extent the medical services, are already integrated but in other branches with their different functions, integration would be more difficult."
