Third Period Robs Raiders in Oakville

Three third period goals by the Oakville Oaks enabled them to dump Georgetown Raiders in the port town Sunday night. It was the sixth consecutive loss by the tail-spinning Raiders.

Oaks needed just one good period to complete the coup. They were outplayed by their desperate visitors for two frames, but managed to take a 2-0 lead into the third period where they opened up. Raiders led at one point and even rallied to tie early in the final session, but Oaks got strong as the game progressed.

The outcome cemented the Oakville club in first place in the COHL and left Georgetown with a 10 wins and 12 defeats record, good enough for fifth place in the six-team loop. A matter of weeks ago the two team positions were reversed.

The Raiders were out to average a 10.5 "rebuck" at the hands of the Oaks when they last met, and played well enough to win but their lack of finish around the net was the killing factor. In their last 5 games they have a goal output average of 2 and a fraction goals per game, which is definitely not enough to win hockey games in the high scoring league they're doing battle in.

The fall off in goal production has been the bugaboo that has dropped them from first to next to last in record time. Moe Galand capitalized on his first chance Sunday and put his club into a 1-0 lead at 2:58 of the first period from Gerry Inglis. Oaks scored before the frame was out, Price getting credit for the goal from Sibick and Milne. Actually, Norm Sibick was the marksman, but the official said it deflected in off Price, who was lying in the ice in front of Barry Smith.

Andy Milne was awarded Oakville's second goal, another doubtful called since it came out of a scramble and just tickled down Smith's arm into the net after he had juggled it high into the air twice. That came at 3:18 of the second period, and the referee even handed out assists on it — Jack Rogers and Bruce Brown.

Wayne Thompson was one of the game's stars but he handed the Oaks their third goal at a minute and 38 seconds of the third period. It was his clearing pass that Gus Karry intercepted and shovelled to Rogers for the counter. Bob Smith, brother of the Raider goalie, finally shattered his hex and scored his first goal this season on Richardson and Demersere were in on this one a minute after Rogers' goal.

Dave Irons was sitting out and against average, and in a penalty when the Oaks went into a 4-2 raid. Jack Price got it from Bill Ford and Karry at the 7:18 mark. The Raiders, the league leaders in first also shorthanded when Oakville place.
