



"Y" Transcends Local Boundaries: Mrs. Ruby

The wide concept of the YM-YWCA as a "relationship between individuals, between different Christian faiths, and between Canada and the world" was stressed by Mrs. A. W. Ruby when she spoke at the annual meeting Jan. 24th of the new Georgetown association.

Mrs. Ruby, a YWCA Canadian vice president, told members they should not limit their outlook entirely to the local scene. The Y plays an important part in development of new countries, and its work among world refugees is another example of the world outlook, she said.




