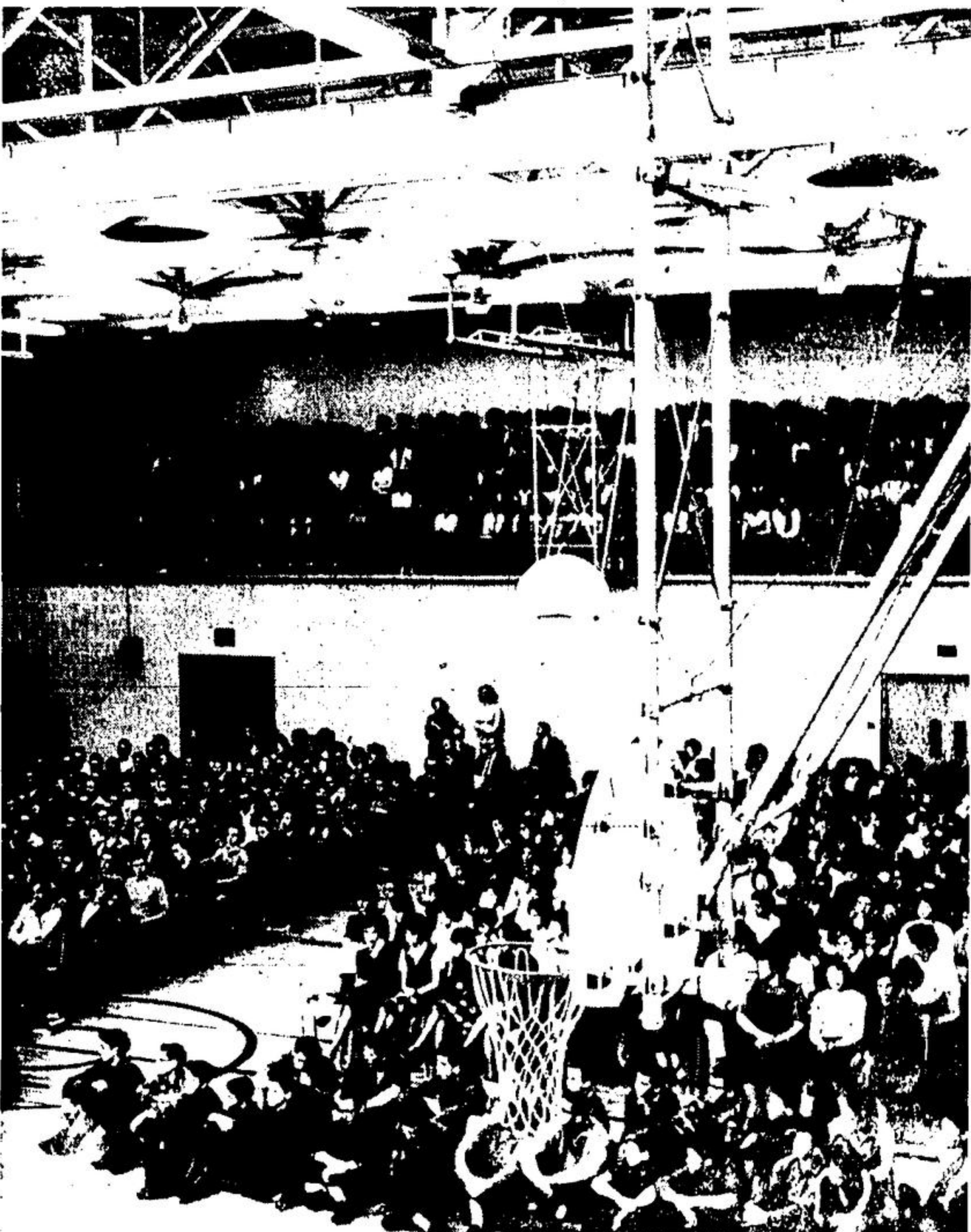

A lifelong resident of Stewarttown, Walter Lawson, died at the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital on Wednesday, Feb. 6th, 1963, in his 70th year. He was the eldest son of the late Walter Lawson and Mary A. (Minnie) Fisher. He attended Stewarttown Public School and Georgetown High School. On September 6th, 1922, he married Flora Peden of Belwood. Mr. Lawson was self-employed as owner of the Stewarttown mill, and he farmed for a short period of time on the 8th Epc north of Georgetown. BELL LINES by Lloyd Denby your telephone manager. Probably many of our customers have noticed the word 'service' in the centre of our company emblem... the bell. As a utility, our service is something we try constantly to improve to keep pace with our customers' needs. 'Information' is an important item not to be overlooked. Every day of the year we receive about 1,200 calls asking for help in finding telephone numbers... quite a task when you think of how quick and accurate the operator must be. Since our information centre looks after we feel that our customers could help us improve the speed of our information service by giving the name of the community first, then the street address followed by the name and initials of the person they are trying to reach. For example, there may be several 'John Browns' on Mill St., who may live in Brampton, Georgetown, Meadowsdale and Bolton. From this you may get some idea of the problems our information operators face when looking up a telephone number. While on the subject, we would like to remind you that you can obtain the telephone numbers for the various airlines for arrivals, departures, etc., by dialling Toronto information 112-555-1212 at no cost to you! The airlines ALL use TORONTO numbers for this type of information and there would be of course a long distance charge when making an enquiry with them. Many of our customer in Georgetown have told us how much they like direct distance dialing or DDD as we call it. Some like the saving in time; to others the saving is counted in many dollars per month. Our studies indicate that 4 out of 5 DDD calls are completed on the first attempt. That is to say, you have an 80% chance of reaching the party you want at a great deal less cost and time to you. Why not use DDD more often for your personal and business long distance calls? We're sure you'll like the difference.
