Les Jackson Will Start Taxi Business

A Keats Ave. resident, Lester Jackson, informed Council Monday that he intends to start a taxi business.

Asking council permission, he was told by Mayor Hyde that, while it has been customary for such requests to come before council, there is no legislation requiring this.

An applicant has merely to comply with insurance and other regulations and procure his licence from the town clerk.

When Cr Jim Young expressed opposition to taxis operating from private homes Mayor Hyde expressed his

opinion that a man has as much right to cut hair or operate a taxi as has a doctor to serve patients in his home.

"If any changes in regulations are discussed, they will need a great deal of study," he told council. "Meanwhile, unless there is something in our by-law prohibiting taxis operating from homes, there is no basis for refusal of a licence."




