An attendance estimated at over 2,000 showed interest in Georgetown's new vocational addition to the high school when the official opening of the new wing took place on February 12th. They toured the new school, expressing pleased amazement at seeing the modern facilities offered to students in electronics, electrical and automotive studies, drafting and woodworking. They saw the new double gym, a cafeteria, music room and Science Labs. And the old grads, particularly, who had attended the original high school not so many years ago, compared notes and agreed that their children are fortunate to have such a completely modern school with so many extra opportunities for learning. Students in blue and red choir gowns conducted visitors on tours of the building prior to the official opening ceremonies in the auditorium. And members of the fire and police departments assisted with parking and traffic control.

**Main Address.** Honorable William Davis, newly-appointed minister of education, gave the main address in the auditorium. The school board chairman, Douglas Lamer, was chairman and vice-chairman Harold Barstow introduced several guests who were seated on the platform.
