Must Break Even So Ambulance Rates Revised Upwards

An upward revision of rates charged by the volunteer ambulance service was made by council on Monday. Locally town residents must now pay \$10 instead of the previous \$5.00 for a ride in one of the town's two ambulances. Esquering residents pay double for their trip to Georgetown Hospital. Specific rates were set for transportation to area hospitals, and a five per cent charge will be levied for those not mentioned in the rate schedule. Another feature is that the town will hold Esquering Township responsible for collection of any accounts incurred by their residents. "We're not trying to make money, just make the G.V.S. carry itself," explained Councillor Walter Gray who with Councillor Smith moved for the new rates. Some minor criticism was expressed though all councillors voted in favour of the bill. Councillor Hildebrandt thought Esquering rates might be on a mileage basis as many residents are close to the hospital. Councillor Powers thought Esquering might be charged rate and a half as I wondered about the town's position if Esquering would not accept the collection of rates. Councillor Gray pointed to a revenue of only \$800 last year and said many accounts are outstanding. At Mr. Young's thought a township might be considered. The new rates are:
