Deep Frost Plagues Town Water, Sewer Lines Freeze

This has been one of the worst winters for water pipe freezes in my eighteen years experience," was Tom Jones, the importance of tree planning which has been promoted by Al Collins' department of the past three years. Flu Bug Not Serious Allow Hospital Visits

Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital won't be limiting visitors to members of a patient's immediate family during the Asiatic Flu outbreak unless things locally get worse than they are now. Early this week some other Halton County hospitals restricted visiting for an indefinite period due to the heavy incidence of influenza.

Hospital administrator Graham Gilhooley said that there had been some staff sickness but other than that the disease hasn't caused any problems here.

Although hundreds of cases of "flu" have been reported throughout the county, no unusual degree of absenteeism is reported at any of the Halton rural and municipal schools, and no major incidence has been indicated at any of the county's hospitals.

"There is definitely no epidemic, but many have it and it is a definite disease," Halton Medical Officer of Health Dr. Archie Bell reported yesterday. "This doesn't seem to be a serious type of the disease, even though this is scant consolation to the sufferer."
