



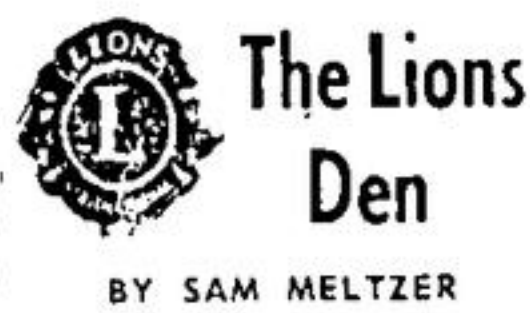
'MIDTOWN' IS BACK
