**Provincial By-Election Possibility for Halton**

Premier John Roberts may call a provincial by-election in Halton County shortly.

Halton has been without representation in the provincial government for seven months — since the death last August of Progressive Conservative Stanley Hall of North Halton.

“Since then Halton Liberals and the Oakville Junior Chamber of Commerce has been pressing for a by-election.

It is known that George Kerr, P.C. provincial candidate, has received important news from the premier's office. Mr. Kerr was scheduled to make an important announcement before a Junior Chamber dinner meeting in Oakville yesterday.

“At the same time, Owen Mullin, Mayor of Burlington and the announced Liberal candidate for the provincial seat, today challenged Kerr, who is also a member of Burlington council.

“I challenge the Conservative,” Mayor Mullin said, “to say in this announcement whether he favours a by-election in Halton at this time.”

“Any hedging on this statement will confirm what I said when nominated. That a delay in naming the date of the by-election will confirm in the minds of the voters in Halton that Mr. Roberts is more concerned with winning this riding than with giving it representation in the provincial government.”

“I like to believe that they (Progressive Conservatives) are scared of a by-election and that the Conservative candidate would prefer to wait for a general election.

“All parties have nominated their candidates,” Mayor Mullin said. “Let's give Halton a voice in the government of Ontario.”

Premier Roberts could not be intercepted to confirm or deny the Halton by-election date.

The Oakville Journal Record contacted Senator Allistar Grosart, former national P.C. head and the prime minister's chief advisor at the station.

“This newspaper understands,” Mr. Grosart was told, “there will be an official announcement of a by-election for Halton County on April 10 — next Wednesday.”

Mr. Grosart said “Yes,” then hurriedly said official confirmation would have to come from Premier Roberts himself.

**Would Require Posters Removed After Events**

A by-law requiring removal of advertising posters from public spots in a stipulated time was ordered prepared by council on Monday.

Cr. Don Powers, in presenting the idea, said old posters are an eyesore and the town should have such legislation.

“A permit to allow posters in the first place might be the answer,” said Mayor Hyde. “The town employees shouldn't have to be the ones to take them down.”

Cr. Jim Young opposed the by-law, believing it would be too difficult to enforce.

**Mountainview Motor Accident Injures Two**

Police placed damage at \$800 in a motor vehicle accident on Tuesday involving a car and a Credit Valley Bottling Works truck.

According to a police report, the truck, a 1959 Ford driven by Albert Clarke of R.R. 3, Acton, had backed out of the driveway at the Bottling Works at the foot of John St. and was proceeding south on Mountainview when a southbound car driven by Frank Kerr of 3 John St. West collided with the back end.

Two men, Frank Kerr, and a passenger, Robert Arthurs of the same address, suffered cut lower lips and Arthurs suffered a bruised nose.

Chief Roy Haley who handled the investigation split the damage at \$400 to the car, a 1955 Chev and \$200 to the poe truck.

**After Tree Pruning Stress Wax Sealing**

A letter explaining that trees are being “butchered” and recommending proper pruning and protection after limbs are cut was received by council from Miss V. Molesworth on Monday.

It led to a motion which would require pruning by qualified personnel and sealing of wounds with tree wax.

Town employees will be instructed to use such safeguards, and the hydro and telephone company will also be asked to cooperate in saving town trees.
