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

Georgetown vs Leamington Hit of Brampton Tourney

Georgetown Wins But Ousted by Quebec

Georgetown Novices had the best of the battle but lost the war at the Novice Hockey tournament in Brampton last weekend.

Last week at paper deadline the Georgetowners cleared a big hurdle by ousting their old Nemesis, Richmond Hill, in a tightly played two-game set. Since then the locals have created quite an impression in the flower town with the result being a determined straight to the final "champions" table.

On Thursday the Novices second serious threat came in the form of one of the most powerful Novice teams in the province, Leamington, which had a 19-19-9 (38) game win streak heading into the tournament.

In the morning session Georgetown came up with a 10-8 win in the first game and with the loss in position in a 2-0 loss in the afternoon.
