In a nutshell, that's the appeal of the North Halton Association for Retarded Children, as they launched their 1963 campaign for \$20,000. Direct mailings to 9,000 homes in Milton, Acton, Georgetown, Esquesing, Nassagaweya and North Oakville will be repeating the same message to every household.  
There will be no house-to-house canvass this year.
