Move To Garage

By November of 1956 the school had grown to six pupils and the classes moved to the basement of Emmanuel Baptist Church, Milton. Enrollment steadily increased and larger quarters were needed. In 1957 the school moved to a converted garage on Brown St., Milton, opposite the arena.

Classes remained there in cramped conditions until last summer when the new \$40,000 school was opened on the Seventh Line a mile north of Hurdly.

The rental location is ideal for students from throughout the large area served by the school, and the new building boasts three bright classrooms, a large music room plus principal's office, grooming room and washrooms.

Today Sunshine has 15 students live from Georgetown, four from Milton, two each from Acton and North Oakville and one each from Essex, Simcoe and Ansonville.

Transportation is the big expense for the school, as driver M. Christensen of Milton travels 173 miles in his four trips a day.
