Warn Water Customers Pay Up or Shut Off

Stringent measures to have the town collect water bills in the hope of the shut off will be taken by Mayor Hyde and avoid any impropriety for the town works staff.

Recently received letters were sent to all who owe such taxes, indicating that water will be cut off unless satisfactory arrangements to pay same made. Council at Monday's meeting backed up the water committee in this.

"I got a lot of criticism when I was chairman last year," said Deputy Reeve Hunter. "But we have to be like the Indians, pay or eat off."

C. Walter Gray agreed that strong measures should be taken but expressed concern that public health officers would disallow the cutoffs.

"Not so, he was told twice," said Jim Emerson. The councilman said the health department had delivered water to each of the houses which had been shut off but had never approached the town to collect their bills.

When Reeve Hunter spoke, he said the town should not be forced to take the water up to 25 cents a cubic foot.

Water committee Chair Peter Evans said his group is also considering 10 cent a cubic foot water rates for those properties under the hookups.

Many water users expect water for only a few months a day so they can't afford to pay more than 10 cents a cubic foot.
