William Henry Mitchell Native of New Zealand

Following five months in the hospital, William Henry Mitchell, an esteemed resident of Limehouse for half a century, died in Georgetown hospital on May 7th.

Born in Ross, Westland, New Zealand on August 17th, 1890, he was the youngest of eleven children of Samuel Mitchell, V.C. of Crowley, England and Agnes Ross of Lossiemouth, Scotland. Only two sisters of the family survive in New Zealand.

On October 4th, 1914, he married Mary Gertrude Grant, who with daughters Mrs. Ed. Ward, Sanford (Agnes Lacey) and Doris and a grandson, William Edward Sanford, survived the war.

Mr. Mitchell was a member of Orion IOOF Lodge and the lodge members held a memorial service on Sunday evening at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home. He was a member of Limehouse Presbyterian Church and his pastor, Rev. Norman Young, conducted the funeral service on May 13th at the funeral home.
