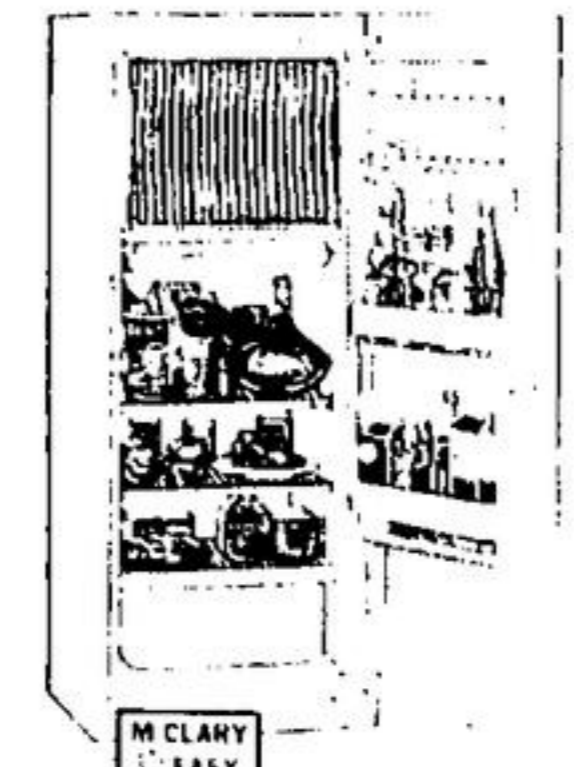

McCLARY-EASY MODEL C1036 10-CU FT REFRIGERATOR

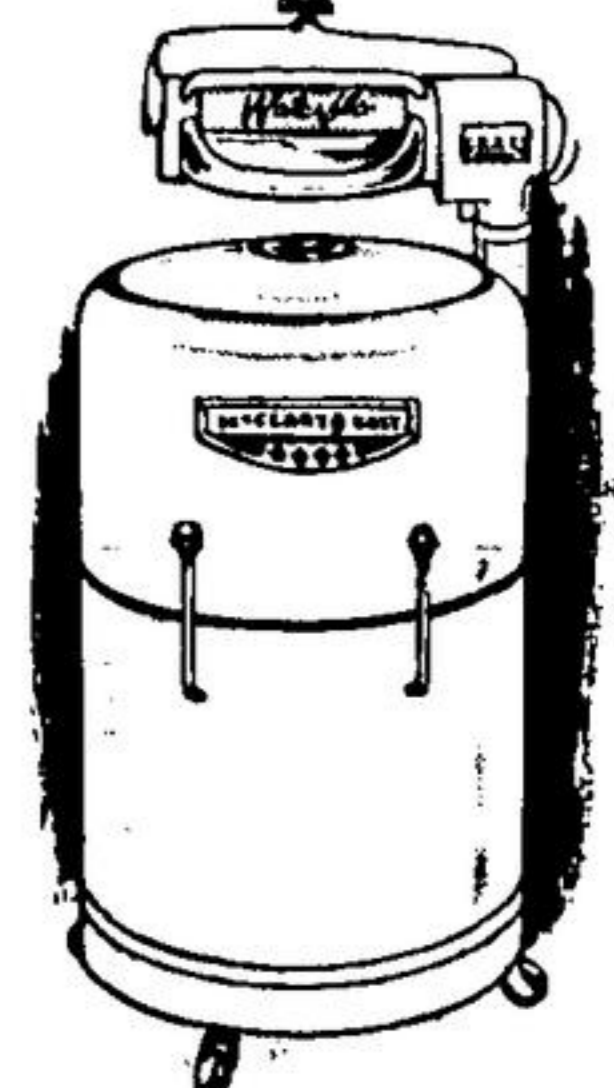
