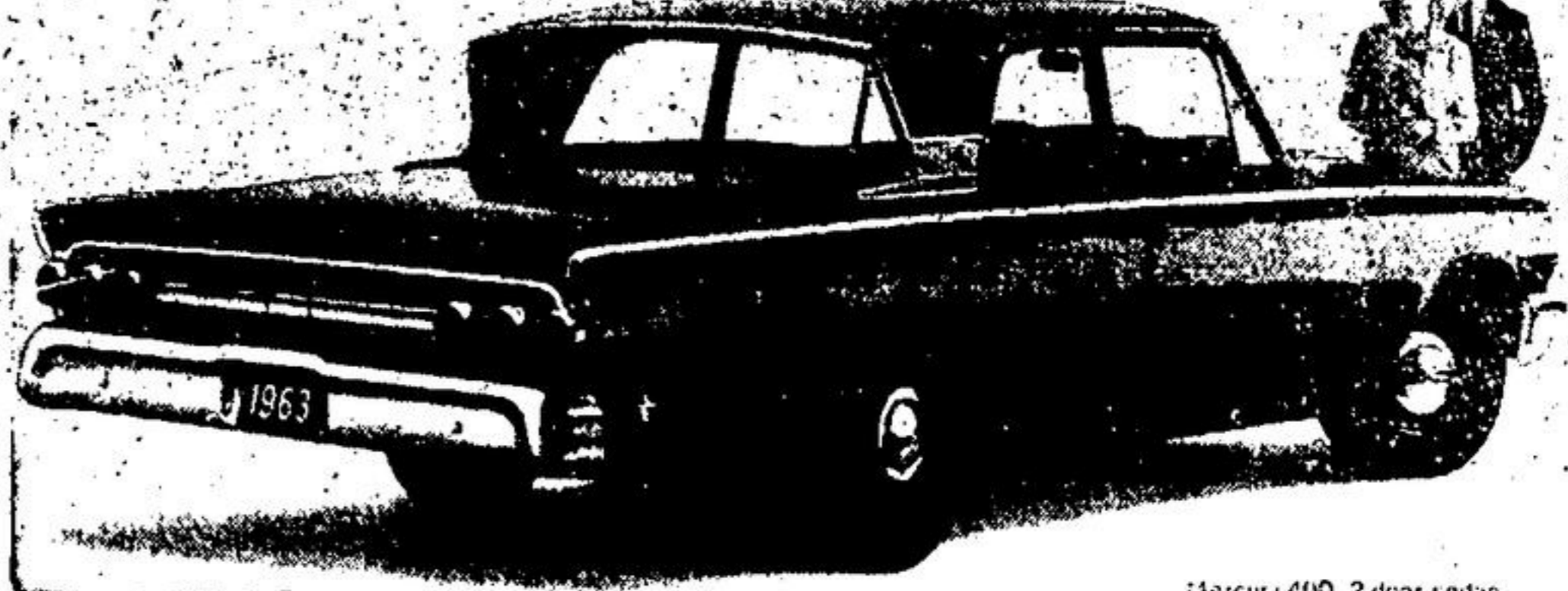

**WIDOWS ALLOWANCES**

New benefits for widows and single women, 60 to 64 years of age, are now available and applications are being accepted for grants up to \$65.00 per month with free medical service and hospital insurance.

This new welfare program will include women who have reached their 60th birthday with income less than \$1,140 yearly, and liquid assets of not more than \$1,000, resident at least one year in Ontario.

Women who may be eligible include: a widow, an unmarried woman, a married woman whose husband is in an institution, or who is divorced or has been deserted for more than 6 months.

The Minister of Public Welfare, Parliament Buildings, Toronto, Ontario OR A Regional Office of the Department in any one of 17 central locations throughout the Province.

**A Reminder to Old Age Security Recipients:**

Free Medical Assistance and Ontario Hospital Insurance may be granted to single persons whose annual income is not above \$1,140.00 and whose liquid assets do not exceed \$1,000.00. These benefits are available to married couples whose annual income is not over \$1,980.00 with liquid assets no higher than \$1,500.00.

**A Note to Those Receiving Mothers' Allowances:**

Persons receiving Mothers' Allowances are advised of a new provision designed to encourage students to complete their education. The allowance may be continued after a dependent child reaches 18 years of age, if the boy or girl is attending a secondary school, and making satisfactory progress.
