Although the College died after the end of the First World War to remain in Toronto, the Norval property, after a long and unfortunate gap, has been used continually since 1939 for weekends in the country, for the study of natural science and the practice of conservation. Norval House, the gift of an anonymous Old Boy, was opened in 1939 and Upper Canada House, an old farm house at the gate leading into the property, was renovated and furnished in 1952 with the same Old Boy as donor.
