Hears Screams Neighbour Rescues Pair

Mrs. Stuart McKenzie and her son Timmy, 2 1/2, were pulled from the burning basement of their home, 24 Mackenzie Dr. by a neighbour, Ivor Washburn, Saturday, after Mrs. Washburn heard her screams for help while working in her backyard.

Mrs. McKenzie went down into the basement when she heard Timmy, who had been asleep there, stirring. When she returned to the stairs to go back up into the kitchen with the boy, she found the steps blocked by flames. She carried the youngster to the narrow window at the rear of the basement and began screaming for help.

When Mrs. Washburn heard her shouts she called her husband and they ran to give assistance. While Mrs. Washburn returned to summon firemen, Mr. Washburn lifted Timmy out through the window and then helped Mrs. McKenzie through.

Fire Chief Bob Bonfield said the blaze probably started the same way as a fire in the cellar of the Rod King home on Temple Road last week. Apparently a natural gas hot water heater ignited fumes from a can of gas. The fire quickly spread to other articles stored in the basement and was back in the stairs and kitchen flooring when the firemen arrived.

Mr. McKenzie was at work when the fire broke out shortly before 6 o'clock. No estimate of the damage was available at press time.

GASSING UP MOTOR BIKE CATCHES FIRE

A motorcycle owned by Dave Stamp went up in smoke on Thursday night when a spark ignited raw gas which had spilled out of the tank after being filled at a service station.

The motorcycle had just been gassed up at Woods Sunoco Service when the rider attempted to start it and apparently touched off the blaze. The bike was a ball of flames as it lay beside the gas pump and had the heat been more intense it likely the pump would have flared up as well. The alarm was turned in at 7:15 just after the regular Thursday night practice alarm.
