PINEVIEW, THE NEW LOOK IN COUNTRY SCHOOLS

Hornby, Glen Williams Tie For Baseball Lead

Hornby Red Shirts defeat Ed Lowville 11-7 in Halton Rural Softball League play Friday to move into a first place tie with Glen Williams.

Red Shirts scored four times in the eighth inning to take the victory. At the time they were leading Lowville by a 7-6 count.

Lowville had notched a pair of two run innings to thicken their attack. They counted singles in the first, seventh and ninth innings.

Red Shirts went to the win on the impetus of a six run first frame. They scored once in the fifth inning.

Gary Hamilton gained credit for the victory although he tied in the 4th inning and Jamie Cunningham who pitched brilliantly da-

ring the remaining five frames.

Three walks, a single and a bases-loaded home-run led to the downfall of the Louisville entry in the first inning. Graham Giles and Jamie Cunningham drew the free passes. John Willmott loaded the sacks with a single.

Dave Leslie powered a 210 foot shot into centerfield that put the Red Shirts off and running to the share of first place in the league standings.

Art Brooks and Dave Chisholm combined to push Red Shirts first inning lead to 6-1.

Brooks drew a walk after Leslie's homer had cleared the path.

Chisholm promptly followed with the second homer of the inning. Chisholm's blast passed the left field barrier. Some 1500 spectators in the crowd of 1500 witnessed said the ball travelled 220 feet.

In the fifth inning, a walk by Art Brooks and a double by Chisholm matched Hornby's seventh run and pushed their lead to 7-5.

In the eighth frame three doubles and a walk were followed by four runs. Giles led the frame when he drew a free pass.

Double by Willmott, Brooks and Leslie scored the runs. Lowville closed out scoring with a run in the ninth.

Bob Coulson paced the losers at the plate with a Homer and a double. Coulson's homer came in the fourth with one man on base.

The day started with door-to-door tagging and later the boys and their handlers marched from the plaza to the park bearing placards and sporting team emblems. The Georgetown Girls' Pipe Band and the Georgetown Citizens' Band headed the procession.

A release from the Minor Ball Association said the organization was most appreciative of the response to the Tag Day and expressed their thanks to all who contributed and helped make the Baseball Day success.
