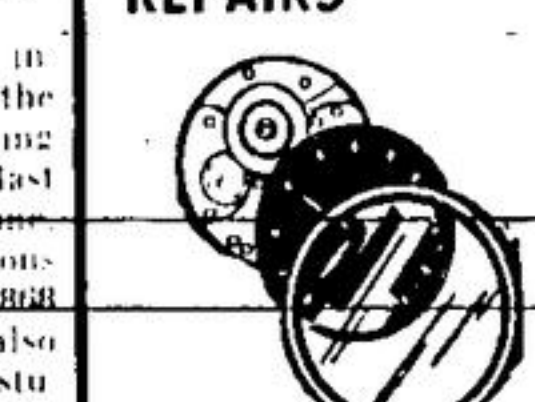
Local Lady Attends Star Island Seminar
