RESHAPE FARM TO THIRD AREA GOLF COURSE

FRAMED BY TWO LARGE oak trees, an earth scraper cuts through the topsoil to become the 15th green at the areas third golf course the new Hornby Tower Golf Club now under construction on the 7th line south of town. Club officials announced details of the new 18 play-as-you-play course this week. The first nine will be ready for play next June, with the second nine to be playable by the following spring. A club house and 260 yard driving range are included in the plans.

New Pay-As-You-Play Golf Course at Hornby

A new concept in public States by 60 per cent in the past few years. A watercourse passing across the property, and a gentle 60 foot elevation from the south-east to north-west corner of the 150-acre farm, make it an "ideal" spot for a golf course. The farm has plenty of shade trees and a bushy border on the one side of the property. Two large artificial lakes will be constructed, for storage of at least 2,000,000 gallons of water. "That's just a start" the director added. A permit has been obtained from the Ontario Water Resources Commission that allows the club to fill the lakes in spring time from the creek, then irrigate the fairways and greens from the lakes during the summer. The lakes will also provide a challenge for the golfer, as one lies beside the 18th green, another by the 14th.

Cost of building the new course is expected to run over \$100,000. Officials note the greens alone will cost \$2,000 each and a \$65,000 estimate has been set for the heavy construction alone. Added to this will be an irrigation system, the club house and dining room, landscaping, pro shop and the driving range.

The existing large brick farmhouse will be used for offices and the club house will be a new section added to the home. A parking lot will accommodate several hundred cars, at the front of the house. Officials promise a variety of holes, well-balanced between long and short fairways, with enough of a challenge to suit the everyday golfer. Rates are expected to be "very competitive."

Moote Associates Ltd. of Toronto was chosen to plan and supervise the layout of the course. Bob Moote is on the board of directors of Hornby Tower, and he is greens superintendent of Oakville Golf Club. His brother Dave, a partner in the firm, is Rosedale Golf Club's greens superintendent.

Work has already started on the back nine - holes of the course first, and these will be ready for play by June 1, 1964. The 270-yard driving range which faces south from the house, and the club house are also expected to be completed by the opening.

The front nine layout will be complete "as soon as possible" after that and should be ready for play by spring of 1965. Officials expect to draw golfers from Toronto as well as from the local area, due to the proximity of the course to Highway 401.

Historic Farm
The Wriggleworth farm is one of the older Hornby area farms. It was owned by Mrs. William Bailey when Fred Wriggleworth purchased it in 1890. In 1932 he sold it to his son Clifford, who continued to use it as a dairy farm until last May, when the property was purchased and an auction sale was held.

Mr. and Mrs. Wriggleworth and their family, who still live in the house, are presently building a new home on the southeast corner of the farm.

Georgetown Giants Beaten Oakville Wins 9th Victory

Oakville Oaks produced 13 hits and nine runs for their ninth victory of the Halton Intermediate League season in Wallace Park last week.

Oaks swept to their 9-1 triumph at the expense of Georgetown Giants who could only muster two hits from the offerings of winning pitcher John McKenzie.

Crisp fielding by Ron Campaigne and Dennis Mendyk helped the 20 year old righthander out of any jam he had incurred. The two fielders combined for three double plays in the game.

Oaks opened the contest with two runs in the first inning. They added a single in the second and pushed another two across the plate in the third frame. They stored three runs in the fourth and one in the sixth. They were held scoreless in the fifth inning.

Giants got their only run in the second inning. Roger Cummings took a life on an error by Roy Lawrence. He scored on Russ Bradley's double.

In four trips to the plate Lawrence hit a single double and a triple. In the fourth inning he hit a long fly to left field.

Larry Curtis and Dennis Mendyk pulled home runs for the winners. Curtis' roundtripper started the third inning.

Mendyk clouted his home run in the fourth with two men on base. Both home runs cleared the left field fence by inches.

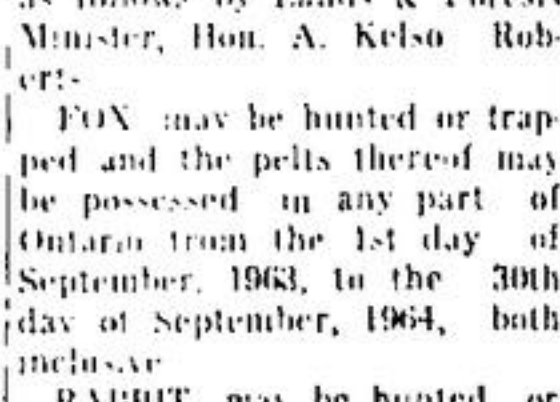
NO SUMMER RESCESS FOR LORNE SCOTS

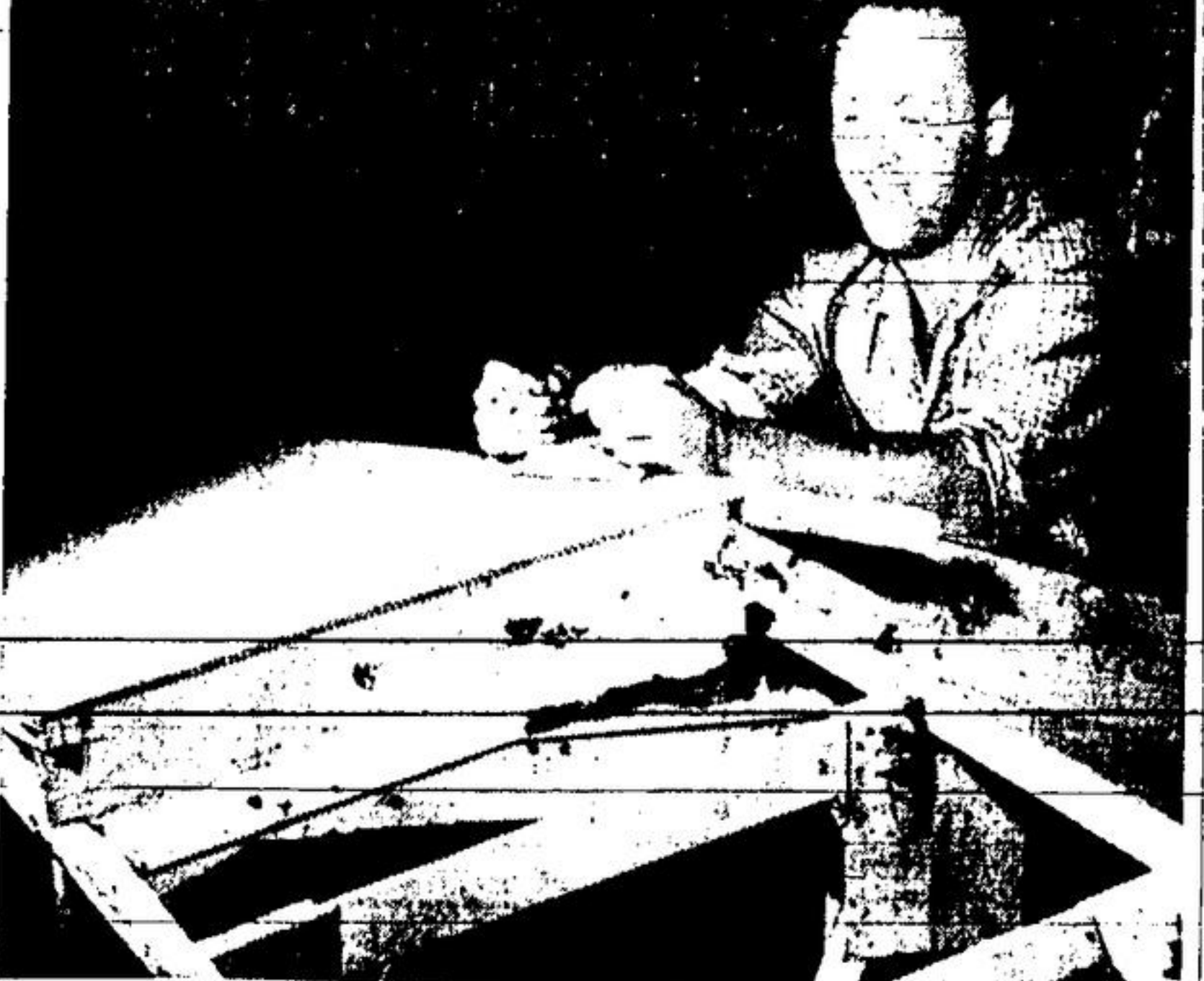
