Carolyn Hallitt Tops Among Girl Students

Two Georgetown high school students have won Ontario Scholarships in their departmental Grade 13 exams. Carolyn Hallitt is the top girl student.

Paul Baker, attained an average of 86.8% and Robert Fisher 86.1%. The average required for an Ontario Scholarship is 80% based on a student's best eight papers.

It was the first time since the Ontario scholarship was created that the necessary percentage was earned by more than one GHS student in one term.

Each scholarship means \$400 towards a university tuition fee.

The top girl, Carolyn Hallitt, just missed the required mark by a slim 1.4%, having attained a 78.4 average.

Paul wrote nine papers and received 1st class honours in all of them. Robert wrote the same number and missed 1st class honours in just two.

Of all the exams tried by GHS, grade 13ers 77% were passed. Forty-two percent received honour marks.

Eight subjects are needed for an Ontario Secondary School Honour Graduation Diploma and nine for university enrolment. Most universities also demand at least a 60% average.

This year the Ontario Headmaster's Association has passed on the tight security imposed on publication of results last year when only subjects passed by each student were released.

Grade 13 subjects in which a student was successful last year and did not repeat have been added in brackets to complete the picture.
